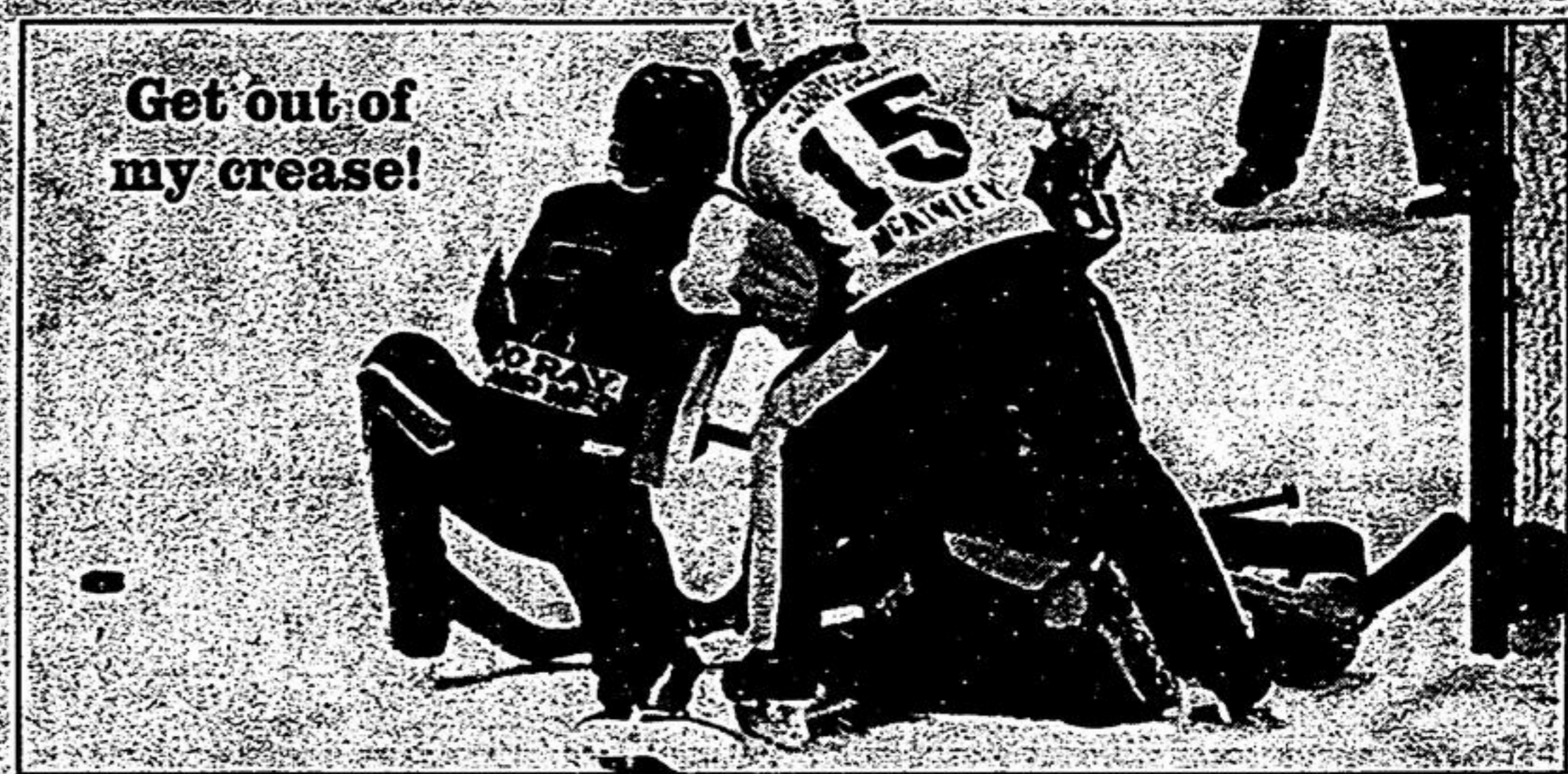

Cost of pheasant hunting rises

WHITCHURCH — If the Whitchurch-Stouffville Conservation Club wants to continue stocking game for the annual pheasant hunt, the cost to do it will rise sharply.
 In previous years, the Ministry of Natural Resources has supplied pheasant poults for the club to raise at a pheasantry. In the fall, these are released in the area.
 However, the ministry has reduced the number of birds every year and none will be supplied this fall.
 To maintain an adequate stock, the sponsoring group will have to provide its own hatchlings, said Wayne Lambert, a member of the Conservation Club.
 These can be raised locally or on a specialized game farm, he noted. "Commercially raised birds generally don't last more than two weeks in the wild. They have the IQ of a chicken."
 He suggested that up to 90 per cent of the pheasants released during the winter: The weasel, redtailed hawk and fox are just some of the predators that feed on these birds.
 No decision on the hunt's future has come out of council or the club.
 The municipality is permitted to sell pheasant hunting licences to pay for raising these fowls. If more than 175 birds are released, licences may be sold for \$4.50 to residents of the township and \$8 to non-residents. If less pheasants are set free the prices cannot exceed \$3.30 for local hunters and \$4.50 for others.
 Additional funds are being made available for capital costs, such as pheasant pen construction, from the Ministry's Community Wildlife Involvement Program.
 Lambert said the stocking program will cost an additional \$1.50 to \$1.75 per hatching this year. They used to be free from the ministry.
 The Conservation Club will hold a meeting to decide if the hunt is still feasible. Lambert pointed out a decision must be made by April to ensure enough time is left to raise the birds. The money generated from licence sales last year was about the same as what was spent on stocking.
 If the sport continues, areas recently developed will be designated as no hunting zones because of public pressure.
