Two services were held honoring Mr. Heaton at the O'Neill Funeral Home. March 8, Rae · McFadden conducted a Legion service for the 71st Battery :(Fourth Division) World War I gunner. The next day, Rev. Cecil Tiller, pastor of Stouffville United Church, was in charge of the public service for family and friends.

Mr. Heaton had been awarded the Legion's 50-year Membership Pin. He was a long-standing member of the Association.

In retirement, he was still actively involved with both organizations, helping out whenever possible. At Richmond Hill, he assisted in the raising of funds for new band uniforms.

As well, Mr. Heaton was an avid angler and hunter, He loved the outdoors. Often he was accompanied on trips by son Roy and close. friends. At age 10, Mr. Heaton arrived in

Canada from Kent, England, and began working at the Todd Morden Brick Yard, East York. He was employed there for a dollar a day until volunteering for service. After overseas duty during
