Recycling Group needs volunteers

STOUFFVILLE—The Whitchurch-Stouffville Recycling Group requires volunteers—people to assist with the operation Thursdays from 10 a.m. to noon and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to noon.

The location is east of the Town Works Department, south of the Stouffville Park.

At the Group's annual meeting, March 12, in Latcham Gallery of the Public Library, it was explained that volunteerism had reached a critical stage— even to the point of hiring someone approximately six hours a month.

It was suggested more people might volunteer their services if they were made more aware of the project.

DONATE \$3,800

During 1985, the Recycling Group donated \$3,800 to various community groups including—Whitchurch-Stouffville Recreation Complex, \$1,800; Markham-Stouffville Hospital Fund, \$1,000; Glenbrook Day Camp, \$500; Whitchurch-Stouffville Softball Association, \$130; Kinsmen Club Santa Claus Parade, \$100.

To date in 1986, an amount almost equalling last year's donations, has been turned over to various community organizations.

Newsprint continues to be the main source of recyclables, totalling fifty per cent of materials received. Corrugated cardboard is next.

FEASIBILITY STUDY

The Recycling Group wants to be involved in a proposed Feasibility Study, authorized by the Town. Doug Hickman told the meeting he'd been in touch with chief administrative officer, Ed Lundman, and was told the project could be expanded to include other municipalities such as Markham, Aurora and Newmarket.

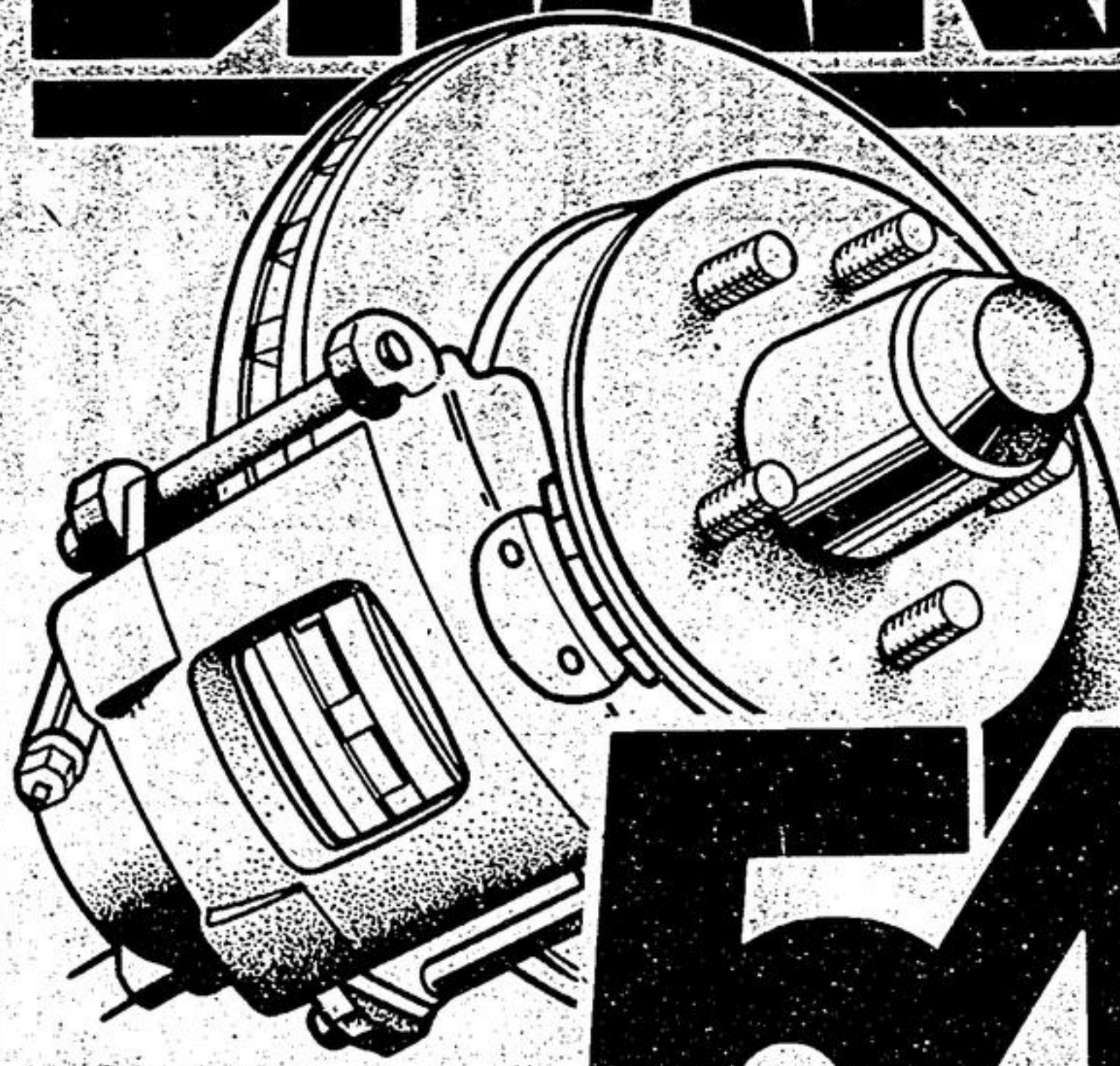

The Library Board periodically reviews the fees and fines schedule, and decided on this change after a recent review. A factor in their decision was the necessity of conforming with the libraries in the newly formed York Public Libraries Network (YPLN) of which Markham is a member. Some fine amounts have been lowered. The increases where they occur, are the first in six years.

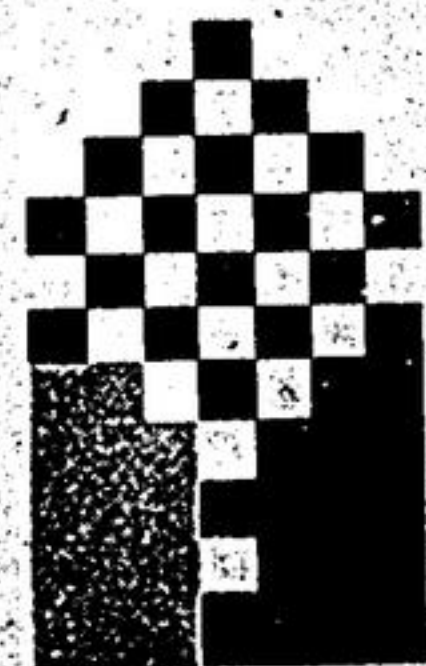
