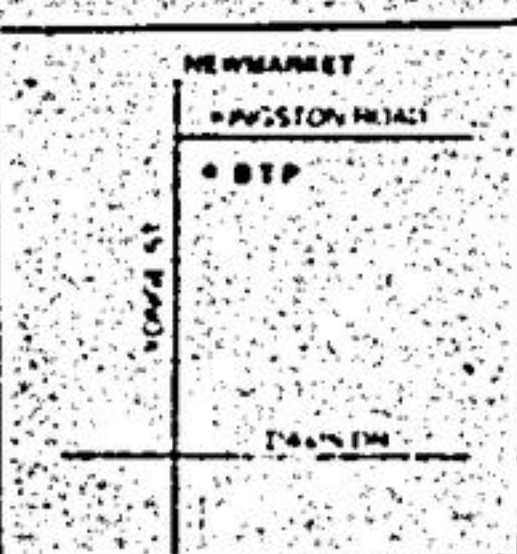

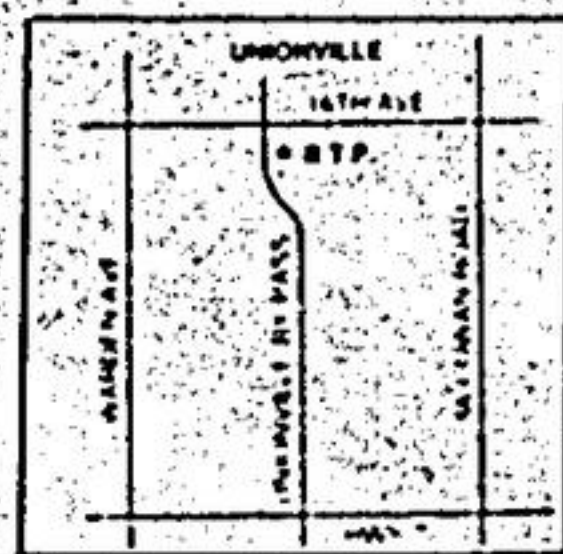

## Living On Purpose

## Lots of Pot Shots

I was only eight years old but I had been shot. One beautiful spring day my older brother and his friend were going gopher hunting on our South Saskatchewan farm. Like all little brothers, I wanted to be included and so tried everything to get them to let me go along. Finally, hesitatingly, they did. I'm sure none of us anticipated I would end up being the gopher.

As we hiked back into the semi-barren pasture we could see the gophers playing tag in the distance. When they heard us coming they politely stood at attention, scanned the landscape and then darted into their burrows. Anticipation turned to frustration as we waited and waited for those overly-cautious prairie dogs to come out and play. They had obviously switched their game plan. Unfortunately we did too.

Boys have to shoot their guns so we turned our attention to things that wouldn't run away. We shot at rocks, flowers and fence posts. (trees don't qualify in Southern Saskatchewan) Our excitement and our competitive spirit intensified as we fine-tuned our aim on smaller things.

Then, my brother had a brilliant idea. Joe 'sharpshooter' was going to shoot a crocus out of the finger tips of his kid brother. Sure I was foolish to go along with it — but some of us will do anything to be accepted.

My nervous tension was exchanged for needling pain with one quick puff from the rifle. I was not the gopher or the crocus but I had been shot.

As I re-live that incident, I realize that most people, at some point in their lives, have been the victims of somebody's thoughtless blast. Perhaps all of us at times have also been behind the trigger.

When the boys forgot the gophers everything became

target material. So it is in real life. When we forget our God-given purpose in life we start taking pot-shots at anything and anybody.

I believe there are many totally unnecessary tragedies in our lives and in our relationships for the exact same reason that my brother shot me. We've lost touch with our original purpose and are, therefore, aiming at the wrong things.

How many bosses are sending home discouraged, hurt and unfulfilled employees? How many teenagers are having their "run-away" tendencies stimulated by a red hot verbal interchange with their equally frustrated parents? How many spouses are walking out on their mate because they just can't take it anymore? How many children will be pushed even further into self-hatred and confusion because of casual put downs from parents and teachers? How many of us will blow someone away today — not because we went hunting for them but because of thoughtless words and deeds?

I don't have the statistics to these questions but I hear the rifles going off all around me.

I doubt that many people actually plan who they're going to devastate. It just seems to happen...by accident.

But that's life! If we don't live on purpose we'll live by accident. We need to ask ourselves what we're really aiming at.

I was lucky my brother was only shooting a pellet gun and equally lucky he only shot me in the finger. Most accidents are much more damaging.

Don't let life be an accident. Find out why God put you here. Live life on purpose...and gopher it!
