

Novice Selects blast 16 goals in tournament

The Stouffville Real Estate Novice Selects easily outscored the opposition 16 goals to 2 in a recent hockey tournament in Sutton.

Ireton, Emmerson, Dickinson, Buchanan and Ferris competed in a sideshow shootout during a break in the series. Buchanan won top goalie honors against 10 other puckstoppers. Dickinson and Sutton's Andrew Murray were the last two shooters left in a field of 18.

Underwood scored Stouffville's lone marker in game three's loss to Sutton. Ireton and Ian Ellis set him up. Emmerson captured Most Valuable Player for his 6-point exploit.

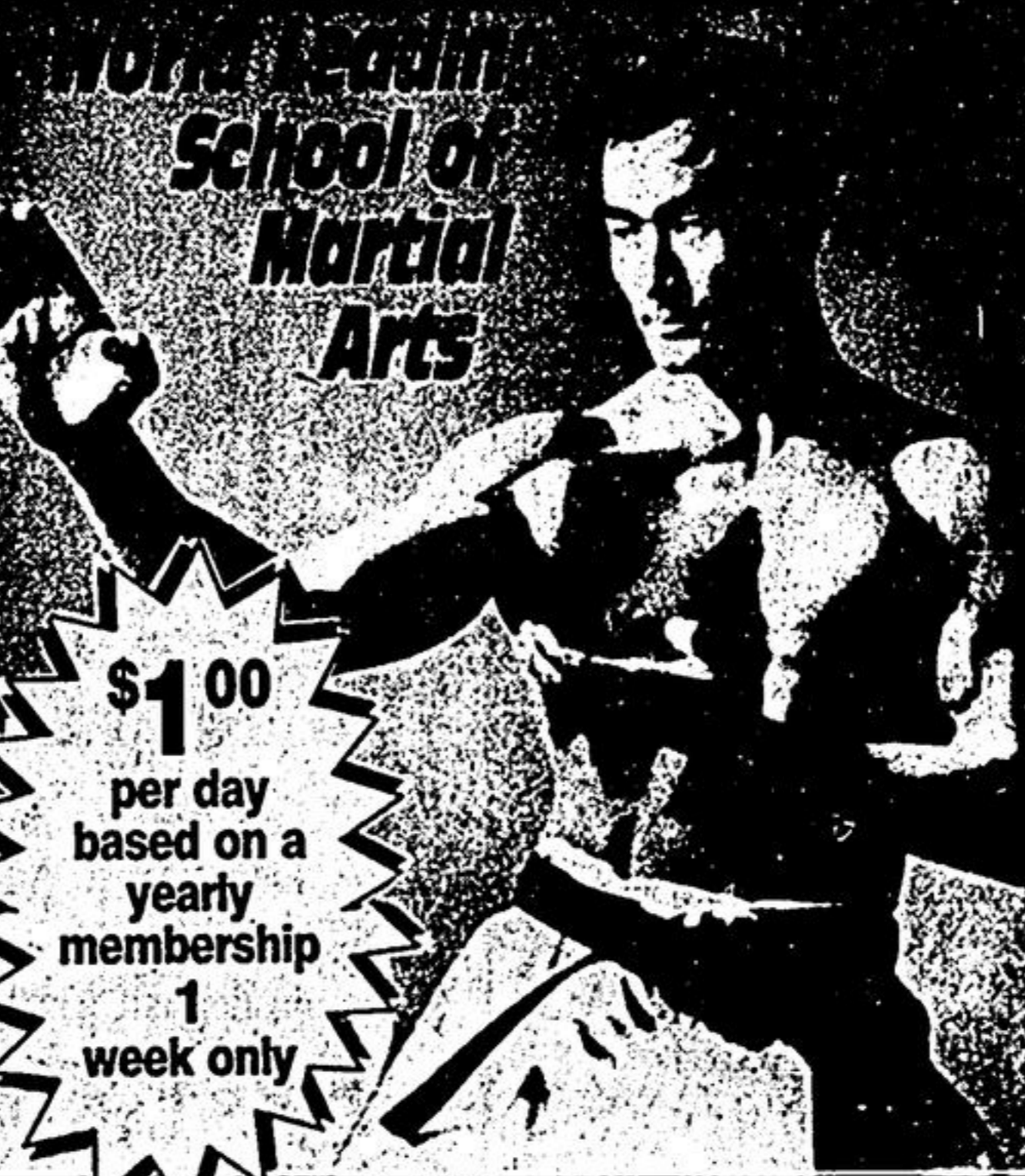
