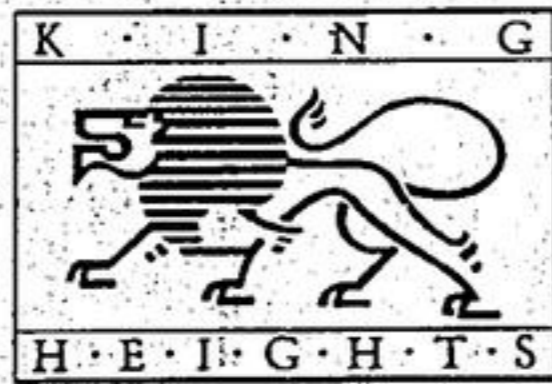

Help available

YORK REGION — Many people don't realize that York Region has a branch of the Ontario Association for Children and Adults with Learning Disabilities.

But executive director Lynn Ziraldo hopes to change that. She recently appeared before Whitechurch-Stouffville Council as part of an attempt to increase public awareness of the association throughout the region.

Ms. Ziraldo showed a slide presentation on the topic then answered question from council members.

"The learning disabled can learn if we have the skills to help them," she explained. "At one time they were called dumb, lazy, careless or undisciplined. Today they are recognized as having a learning disability and with appropriate help they can develop coping skills to reach their full potential. They can become useful contributing members of society."

There are five Whitechurch-Stouffville schools presently working with learning disabled students, according to Ms. Ziraldo, who said her organization is supported largely by public donations.

She's requesting financial assistance from Stouffville Council and the other municipalities in York Region.

The association was formed in 1963 to help children with learning disabilities. Its mandate was expanded in 1984 to include adults.
