

Health Study Office opened in Stouffville

STOUFFVILLE — The site office and telephone lines for the community health study of Whitechurch-Stouffville, East Gwillimbury and Tecumseh were opened March 18.

Goss, Gilroy and Associates Ltd., the firm hired for the job, has established an office at 36 Main Street.

The health comparison of Whitechurch-Stouffville residents and those of the two other areas is scheduled for completion by the end of June.

The Whitechurch-Stouffville office will be staffed full-time, beginning April 7. Until then, telephone calls will be tape recorded and answered by project staff at their earliest convenience. The number here is 640-7252.

Those living outside the calling area may call, toll free, 1-800-387-0407.

This study, sponsored by the Ontario Ministry of Health, will determine whether Whitechurch-Stouffville residents are experiencing adverse health effects, which may be attributed to contaminated water. The communities of East Gwillimbury and Tecumseh were selected as control groups because they have similar population characteristics and are relatively close to Whitechurch-Stouffville.
