# Student job program provides experience

This newscolumn is the second in a two-part series on youth employment opportunities. Last time, I discussed the Student Venture Capital Program. This time I will emphasize Summer Experience '86 and the Ontario Youth Employment Program.

Experience '86 will provide summer employment for more than 7,000 students in over 100 Ontario Government ministries and associated organizations. It is an opportunity to gain experience in career-related jobs. In the past, students have worked in such places as libraries, art galleries, provincial parks, public health labs and the list goes on.

There are several requirements for eligibility to the program. You must be a student, eligible to work in Canada and between 15 and 24 years of age at the commencement of employment. To provide career-related work experience for as many young people as possible, students may

not be hired for more than two summers on the program and must not be hired on the same project, except in a supervisory capacity. Participants may not be hired or supervised by a person who is a member of their immediate family.

The deadlines for application are as follows:

April 9 — post-secondary school students  
April 23 — secondary school students.
