SDSS holds open house to display achievements

STOUFFVILLE — In conjunction with the Ontario-wide Education Week, beginning April 27, Stouffville Dist. Secondary School will hold an open house April 30, from 7 to 10 p.m. — the first in eight years.

Vice Principal Rod Leonard told The Tribune this event is based on the theme, "Stouffville, a community school that gives the students a well-rounded education."

The open house is not just for parents, students and staff, he explained. "It's this town's school and we want people to see what we're doing."

He said the evening's activities will "ideally involve every aspect of the school."

The following is a list of programs scheduled for the evening:

All the shops will be open with students' projects on display and demonstrations with the technical equipment.

Family Studies students will

host a fashion show, modelling their own creations.

The gymnasium will be transformed into a square dance hall with the audience's participation expected through the two sessions.

The school's four bands will perform concerts throughout the evening.

The Art department is asking former students, who excelled in art to submit their work for display alongside the current students' projects. Pupils will be on hand demonstrating their flair with various media.

Students are scheduled to be in the labs to do science experiments.

The Geography department will teach participants the basics of map-making, using aerial photographs of the Stouffville area and students' work.

The Special Education department will hold a session on teaching strategies.

In a coffee-house setting, Jim Rehill, working with the English department, will delight the audience with poetry and other readings.

Student-made software will be demonstrated on computers and the audience is invited to try using

the electronic brains.

Staff and students working together will set up a memorabilia room, with every year book since the school opened in 1953, scrap books, old football uniforms and other interesting items. Former students and staff are asked to submit items to be displayed, including several year books the school no longer has copies of.

The Cafeteria will be the hub of activity with three programs running continuously. These include: Principal John Nikifork and Vice Principal Rod Leonard periodically tending to the barbecue, as chefs; the Moderns department hosting a "European Cafe," serving German deserts and crepes with coffee and tea; and the Family Studies pupils creating and serving non-alcoholic drinks.

The vice principal said he hopes to hold this kind of event every three years, explaining, "they wouldn't be as special if they were held yearly."

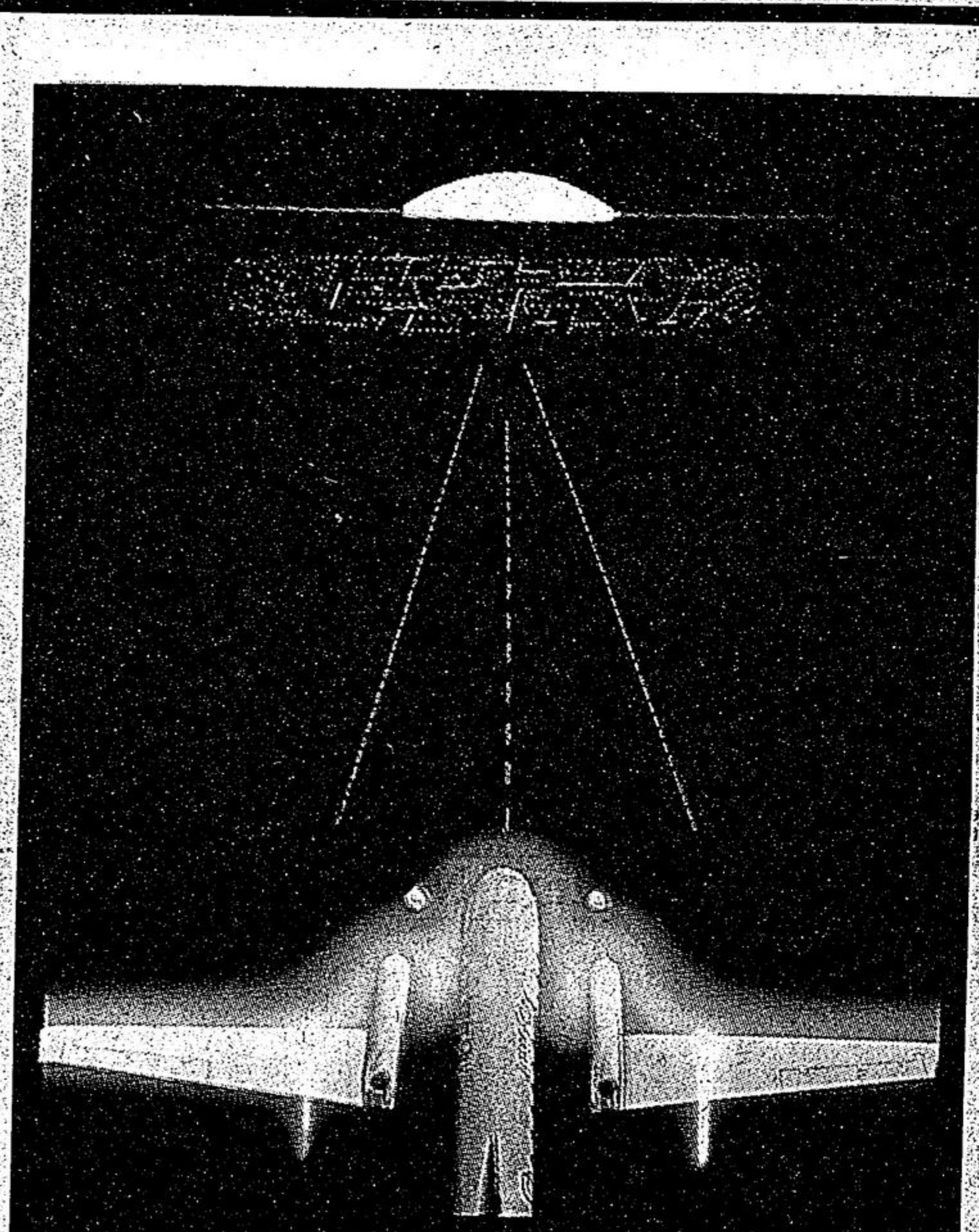

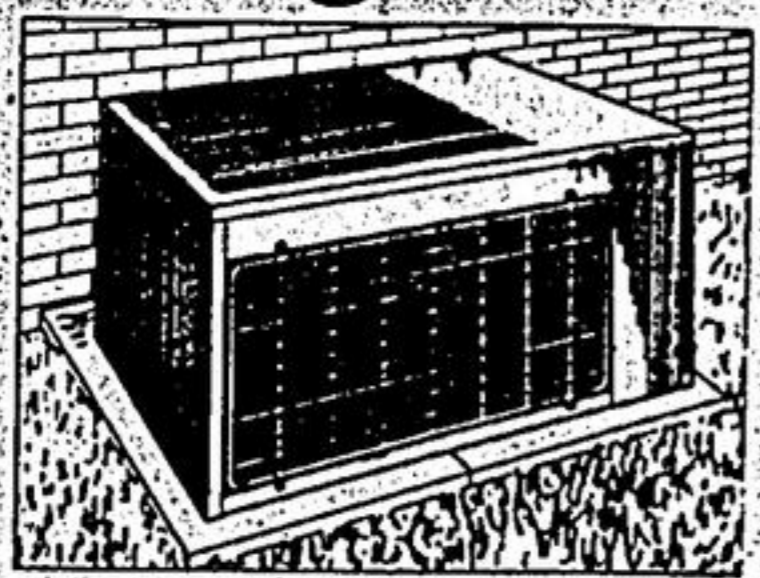
