Student volunteer surprised that she won March award

At the end of this school year Michelle Kamski, a Grade 11 student at Markham District High School (MDHS), will receive an award for her volunteer work, judged tops in the school for March.

But she may still not know who nominated her for the honor in the first place.

"I have no idea who nominated me," she said. "It was a complete surprise."

Michelle learned she had won the award about two weeks ago and despite her uncertainty about who's responsible for putting her name forward, ("I think it was someone at work") she says she is pleased with the honor.

"It's nice to know that your work is helping someone and they appreciate it," she said.

Most of Michelle's volunteer work is done through her affiliation with St. Patrick's Church.

In addition to working part time

as a receptionist at the church, Michelle helps her mother with Saturday morning instructional services.

She is also a co-ordinator of the church's youth group Service In the Name of God (SIGN). This group organizes dances and events to raise money for various charitable causes.

A recent project for the group was to raise money for famine relief in Africa by holding a special lasagna dinner for a target of 150 people. "One-hundred and twenty-one turned up which isn't bad," she said. "Making all that lasagna was a lot of fun."

Michelle also acts as the youth co-ordinator for the Bestview Health Care Centre, enlisting help and makes gourmet dinners for residents. She says she particularly enjoys this job.

"After awhile you get to know the residents and they can teach you a lot," she said. "I get a lot of reminiscing, but they are stories you can remember."

And annually she says she canvasses door to door for the Share Life group, another church organization that raises money to needy causes.

At MDHS she is a member of the Wind Ensemble, "the top band in school," and after she graduates plans to go to university to study accounting.
