New chairman for '86 UW campaign

Carmen Di Paola, president of Carmen Di Paola Real Estate Ltd. in Markham, will head York Region's 1986 United Way campaign.

The announcement was made last week by Kent Hill, president of United Way of York Region.

De Castro paintings at Markham gallery

Selected paintings of Canadian artist Alberto De Castro, slated for exhibition in Paris on May 8, are on display until 6 p.m. today at the Bremner Gallery in Markham.

Eighteen paintings and some framed lithographs are for sale with prices for the paintings ranging from \$900 to \$7,500 and for the lithographs \$285 to \$550, according to gallery owner Paul Bremner.

Mr. De Castro, who lives in Toronto, is a "naive" style artist

meaning he exhibits a simple, informal style according to Mr. Bremner.

"It's not academic, it's not formal," he said. "I think he is quite a unique, original artist."

Mr. Bremner says it is the use of color and the family-oriented subject matter that makes Mr. De Castro's work popular.

"It's so pleasing to the eye in terms of color and the images," he said. "We're very proud to be hosting this exhibition that is going to Paris."
