STOUFFVILLE — When it comes to delivering newspapers, fourteen-year-old Mark Hoover is a veteran.

He's been a Tribune carrier almost two years, beginning back in June, 1984.

"I dropped into the Office and asked," replied Mark, when questioned how it all began. In addition to 22 Wednesday papers, he also delivers 40 Tribune Weekenders every Saturday.

Mark is the son of David and Carol Anne Hoover, 24 O'Brien Avenue.

"I hope to keep my route at least one more year," Mark says. With his earnings, he helped buy his own 10-speed bike and plans to cover a portion of the expenses involved in a Grade 7 trip to Quebec this spring. Mark is a student at Orchard Park School.

Whenever he's sick, sister Leanne, 11, willingly lends a hand. When they go on holidays, Lyn Nicholson of Winlane Drive takes over.

Mark's parents provide the necessary encouragement.

"It's an excellent way to learn the meaning of responsibility and the value of money," Mrs. Hoover says.

Mark's route includes all of O'Brien Avenue and a portion of Main Street between O'Brien and the C.N.R.

He only has two collections. The rest are pre-paid.

Mark enjoys playing ball and helping his dad at the shop. Mr. Hoover operates Hoover Machine & Welding, 311 Main Street West.
