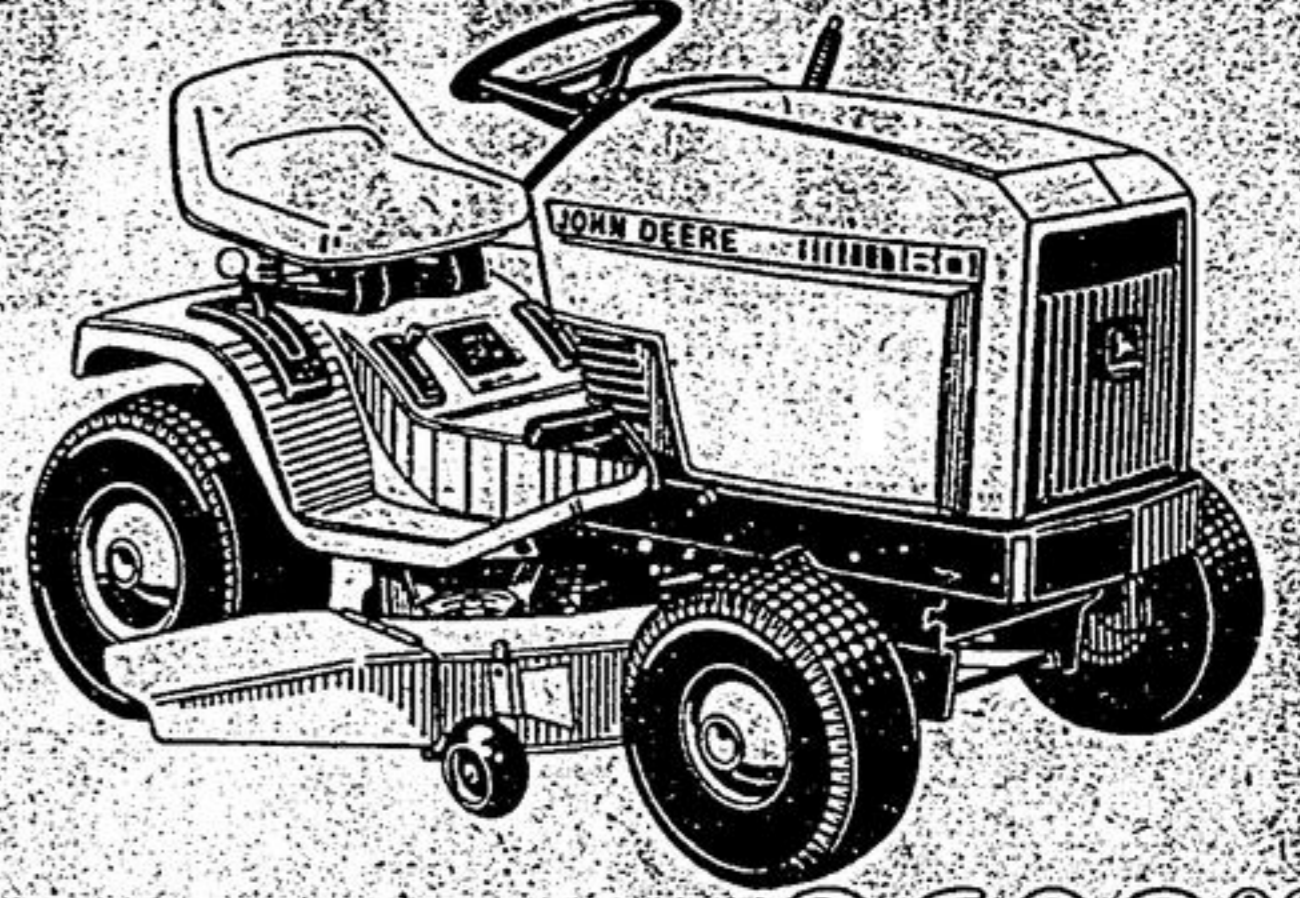

Vandorf man pleads guilty

VANDORF — A 23-year-old Vandorf man pleaded guilty to a charge of causing mischief by wilful damage when he appeared before Judge Robert Osborne in Newmarket Provincial Court.

Michael Birrane was given a suspended sentence and placed on one-year term of probation.

The accused was arrested after kicking in the door of an apartment in Aurora last January. Damage was estimated at \$350.

Counsel for Birrane said his client had been drinking heavily prior to the offense. He described the man's actions as "foolish".

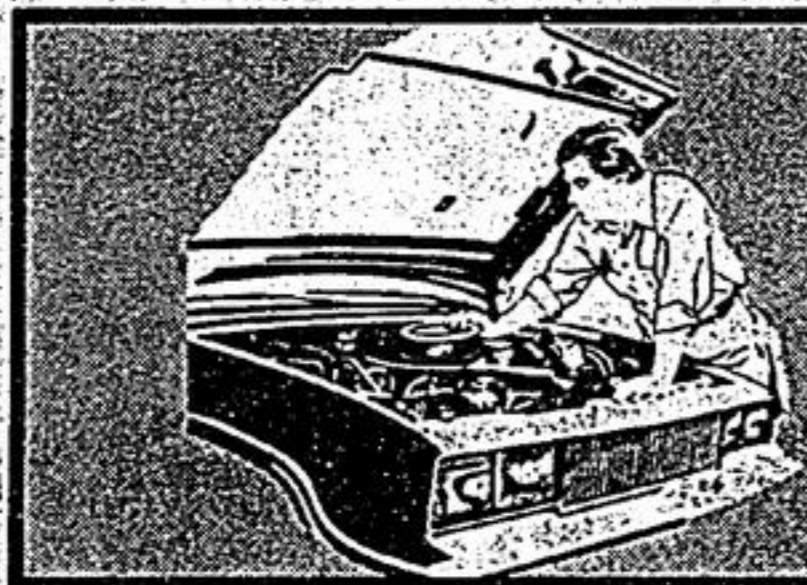
