# Anglers await season

WHITCHURCH—Area anglers will find plenty of good fishing opportunities right in their own backyard when the trout season officially opens Saturday, April 26.

The Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (MTRCA) offers a total of five fishing sites, including Bruce's Mill in Whitchurch-Stouffville. That conservation area is located on Stouffville Road, east of War-

den Ave.

The public's also welcome at MTRCA's Greenwood facility in northern Pickering; Albion Hills, north of Bolton; Glen Haffy near Mono Mills; and Heart Lake in the Brampton area.

Anglers can try and land rainbow, brown and brook trout at these facilities beginning at 8 a.m. opening day.

After the first weekend, fishing hours at Authority sites change to

10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Parking costs \$2.50 per car on weekdays and \$4 on weekends.

Wouldn't it be nice to practice

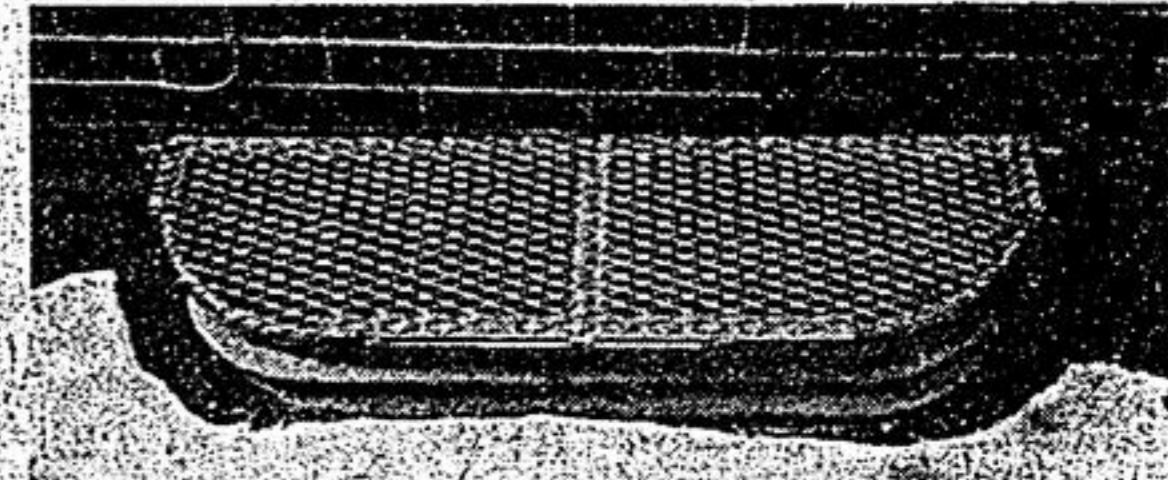
That fine way of acting, too

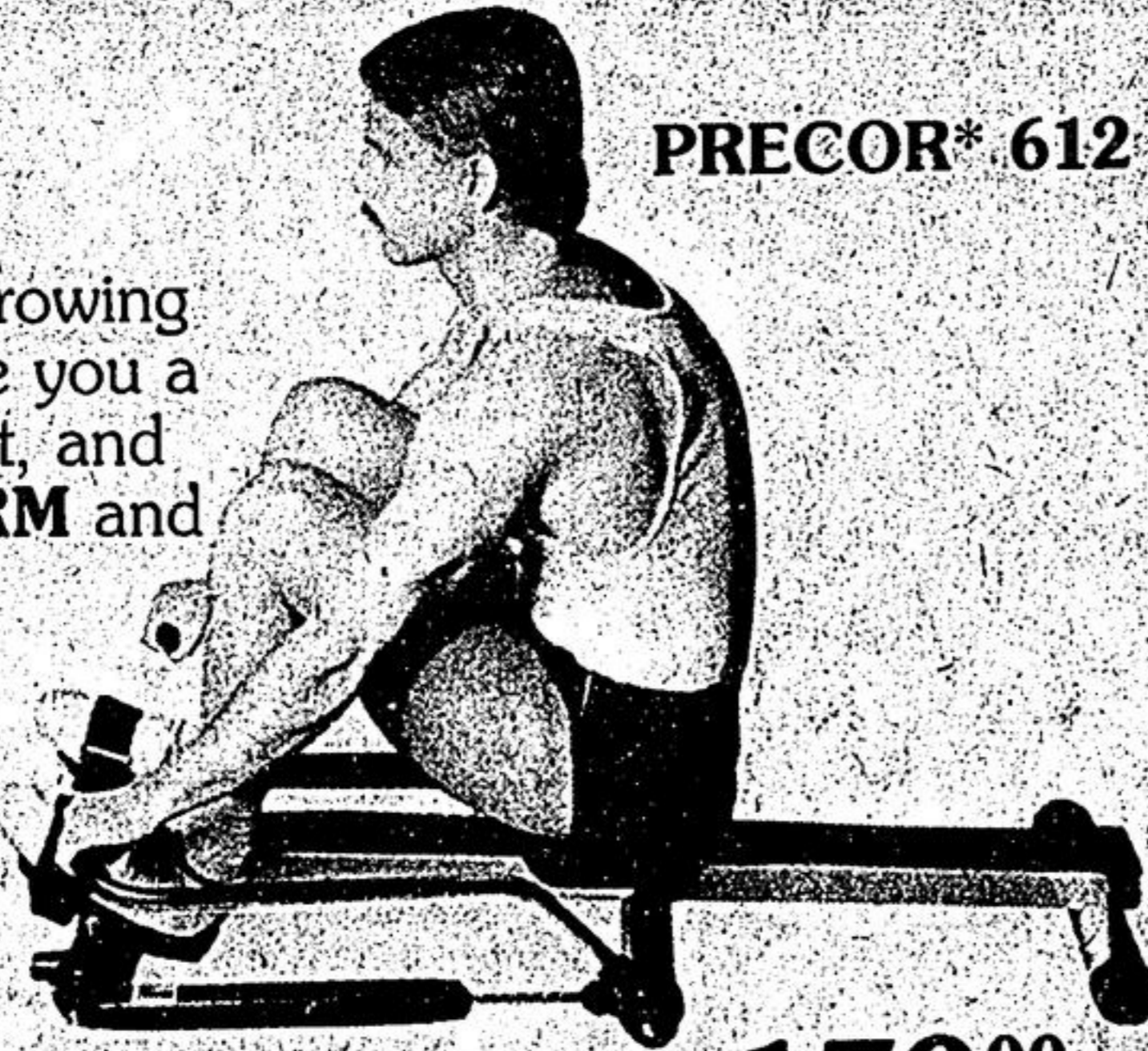

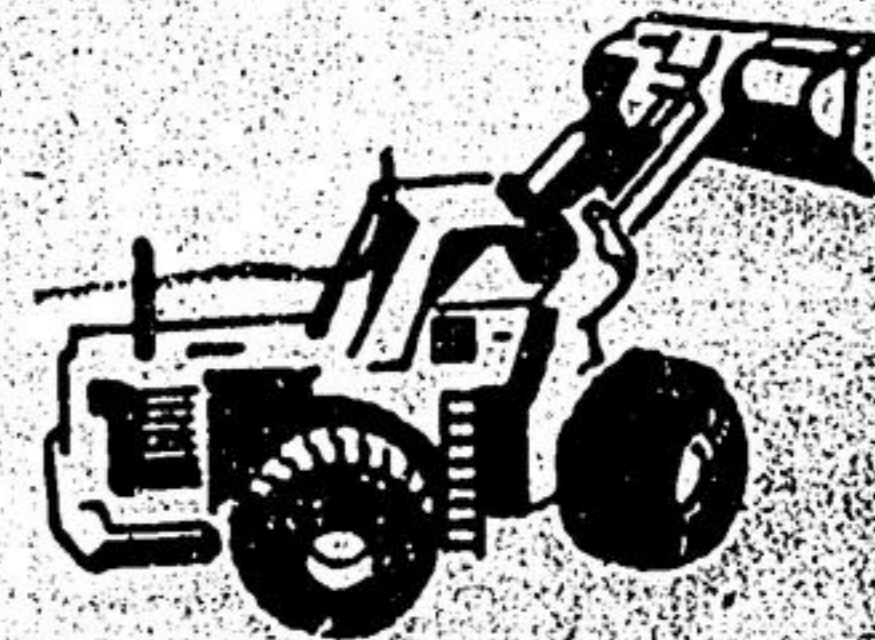
