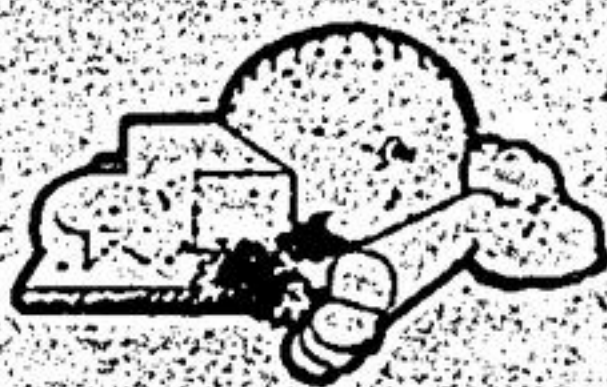

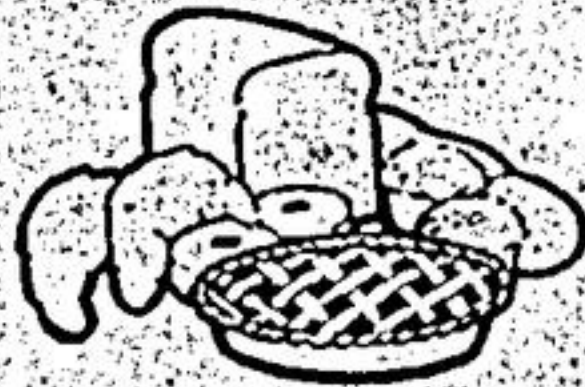

A new aquatic craft makes its Canadian debut on Musselman's Lake today (April 26) from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. According to designer Louis Chia of Singapore, his prototype Dolphin recreational vehicle combines a "speed boat hull and dry bike deck with the speed of a jet ski." When propelled by a 25 horsepower motor, it can reach 35 m.p.h. Dolphins have been successfully marketed in Florida and may be included in an upcoming

episode of television's Miami Vice. Mr. Chia's now looking for a Canadian production site in conjunction with Gord Hamilton, owner of the 21st Century Centre at Glendale Beach. The fibreglass Dolphin, described by the manufacturer as a "versatile little craft," would retail here for about \$2,000. ## Snow plowing rodeo

Uxbridge and Pickering will challenge other municipal crews in Durham Region Public Works Association's third annual snowplow rodeo.

A 9 a.m. start is scheduled for Saturday, May 24 at the regional Oshawa/Whitby Depot, located on Conlin Road about a quarter mile east of Thickson Road.

According to a press release, the event's purpose is twofold: To have a friendly competition between all the municipalities within the Region, and to determine the best snowplow operating team; to try to make the public aware of the professionalism involved in public works activities.

"Winter maintenance is an operation unique to municipalities and cannot be measured by any yardstick," according to the release. "Perhaps this event will help increase understanding of the difficulty of these drivers' jobs."

It includes a written test on the rules of the road; a circle check on a vehicle (to find defects); and a driving test. Trophies will be awarded the winners.

The public is welcome to attend, but spectators are advised to bring lawnchairs.

Durham's meet is patterned after a similar rodeo which has been held in the Chicago area for the past decade.
