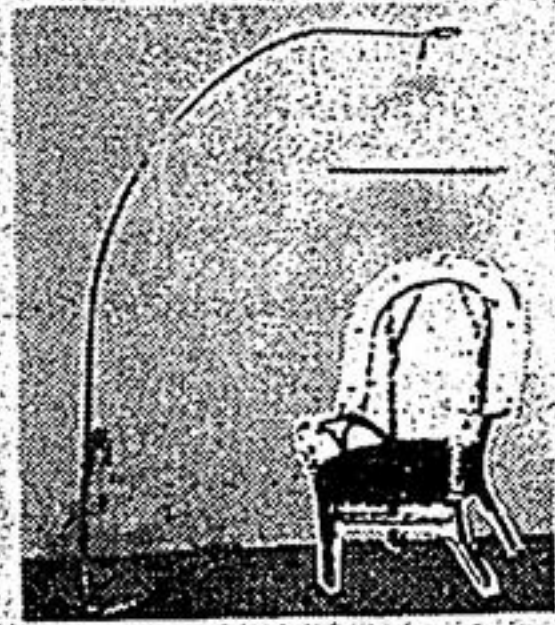
A Markham extravaganza

See the latest in forestry technology

Ministry of Natural Resources scientists are currently developing stronger, taller, faster-growing trees that resist pest and disease at their Maple research centre.

In honor of National Forest Week May 4-10, the public is invited to the Ontario Tree Improvement and Forest Biomass Institute (OTIFBI) to witness these advancements in tree regeneration.

The first 500 visitors to the OTIFBI at its May 9 and 10 open house will receive a potted white pine — Ontario's official tree.

With worldwide forest resources shrinking, researchers are trying to find new ways to regenerate forests quickly with fast-growing, top quality trees.

Some of the breakthroughs scientists have made in recent years include new greenhouse techniques that improve seedling quality and survival, and better seed collection and processing techniques.

Another advancement allows one bag of seed to grow 200 hectares of genetically-improved forest and regenerate neglected forest stands.

The OTIFBI open house is at the Southern Ontario Research Station on Dufferin St., north of Major Mackenzie Dr. Researchers will be available from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m.
