Wendell Fisher, vice-principal at Uxbridge Public School, will occupy the principal's desk at Goodwood.

Mr. Hannah has been involved in a wide variety of extra-curricular activities during his eight years at the Uxbridge Twp. school.

He praised Goodwood's students, parents and staff members, stressing that he'll miss his association with each of them.

Mr. Hannah began his teaching career in 1961. He became vice-principal at Uxbridge Public School in 1969, then moved into the

same position at Joseph Gould Senior Public School three years later.

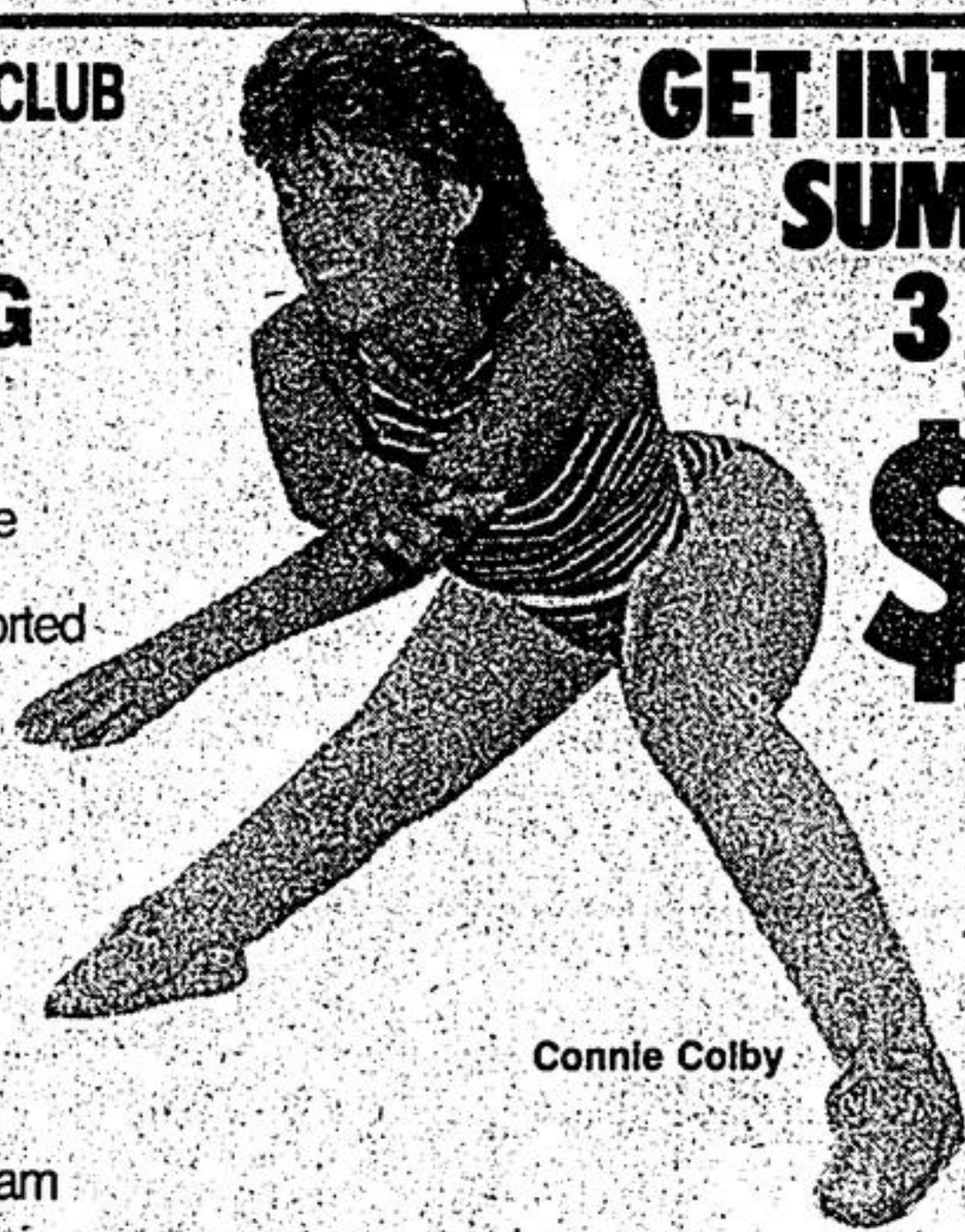

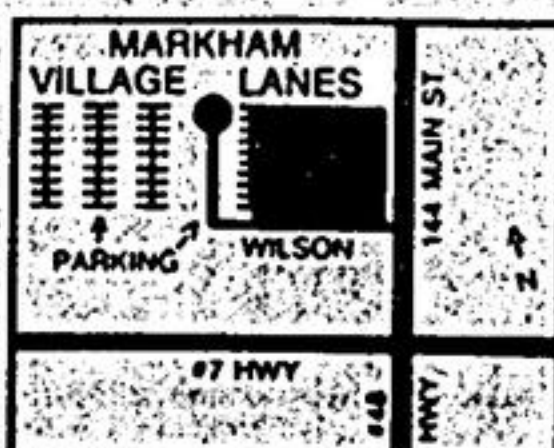
