It was love at first sight

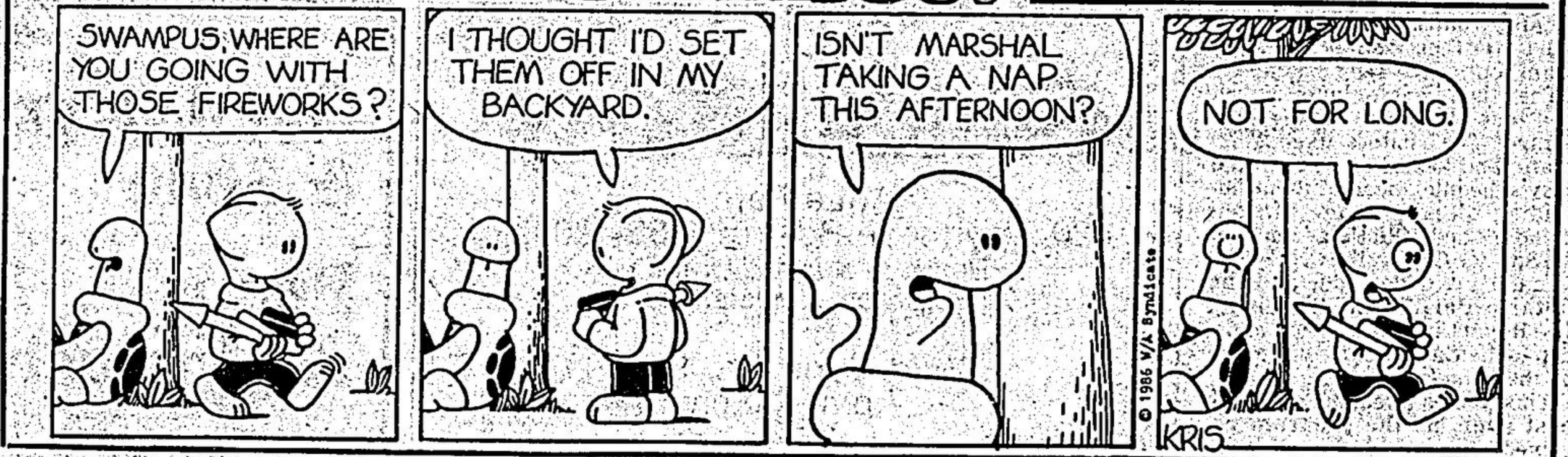
I know someone I'd love to meet,

His songs are all just the best,

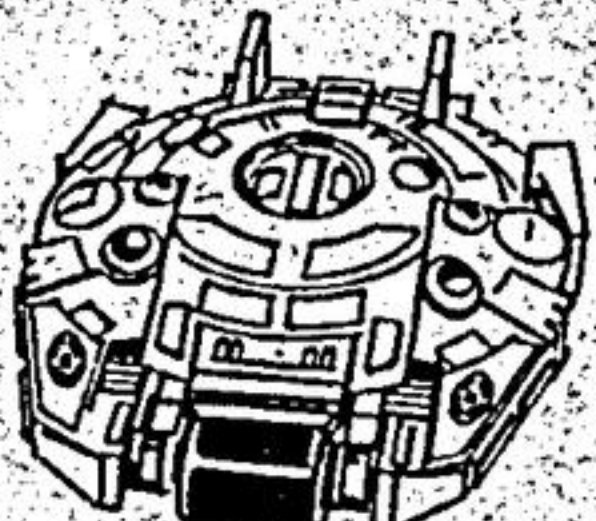
His name is Corey if you haven't already guessed,

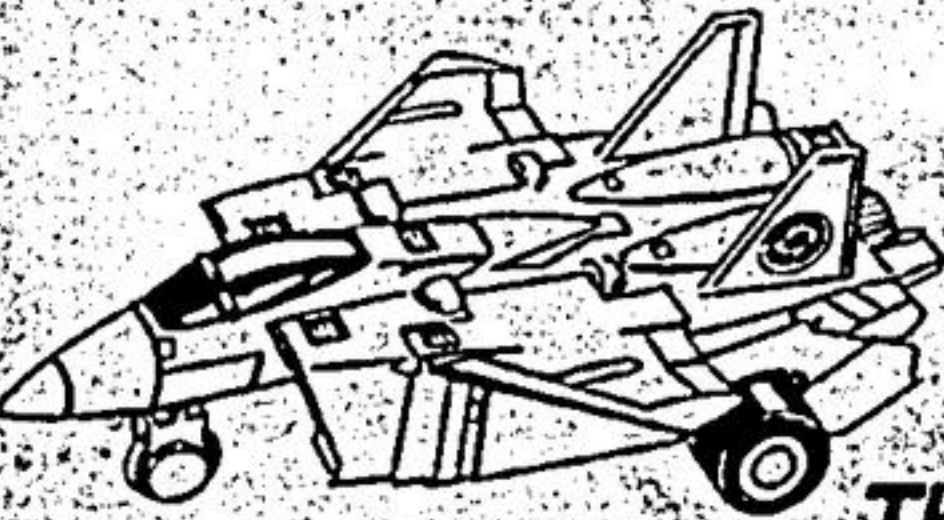
