Walking tour at Sharon Sunday

June Day, held on the first Sunday in June at the Sharon Temple, has traditionally recognized the June 7 birthday of the Temple's founder, David Willson. This year, June Day will be held on Sunday, June 1 and festivities include walking tours of Sharon which pass by where Willson's house and other Children of Peace buildings once stood.

Visitors may assemble at the Sharon Hall adjacent to the Temple from 2:30 p.m. to join the 45 minute walk along Leslie St. Members of the newly-formed Heritage East Gwillimbury will lead the tours. Sturdy, comfortable shoes are recommended.

At 11 a.m. all are welcome to join the congregations of Sharon and Queensville United Churches and Holland Landing and Sharon

Anglican Churches in a joint service. A light lunch will be for sale by the Sharon Temple Volunteers after the service.

Demonstrations of pioneer crafts and skills as well as tours of the Temple, surrounding buildings and gardens begin at noon and continue until 5 p.m. An expert in genealogy will assist those wishing to trace their family tree.

All June Day activities are included in regular admission to the Temple: \$2 for adults; seniors and teens \$1 and children 50 cents.

Sharon Temple is on Leslie St. 4 kms north of Newmarket. For further information call 478-2389. As an historic site, Sharon Temple is open daily from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. except Fridays. Open every day in July and August.
