Golf centre offers equipment, lessons

"This is the largest golf centre in Canada," said sales promotion manager Lionel Lancaster.

Thornhill's Dynamic Golf Centre is more than 15,000 sq. ft. of golfing paraphernalia.

A variety of top pro-line golf clubs and equipment is sold at discounts of up to 50 per cent off list prices, he said.

"We have a huge range of golf bags, carts, shoes, gloves, sweaters, shirts, slacks, and all other golf accessories," he added.

The new spikeless golf shoes, which are lighter and less expensive than their metal counterparts, reflect a new trend in golfing

apparel. They account for more than 60 per cent of shoe sales, he pointed out.

Patrons can also have equipment refurbished or clubs regripped at the repair centre or can watch instructional films on golfing in the lounge area.

Canco Collision

Repair, body shop has grown in 3 years

When Doug Cole bought his auto repair business more than three years ago, interest rates were up and business was down. "People were selling businesses, not buying them," he said.

But, taking the attitude "if you can make it in those times you can make it any," Mr. Cole took Canco Collision and expanded it to include general repairs.

Since then, the shop has grown to employ 22 people, up from an original seven, and Mr. Cole is the owner of four buildings in the area.

Mr. Cole says he bought the shop because he saw a need for a personalized auto service in Markham and felt the existing shop lacked that quality.

"I thought Markham was a viable area that needed the service (and) I wanted to make it a more aggressive organization," he said. Mr. Cole added he tries to cater to his customers.

In addition to doing repairs and painting, the shop also specializes in air conditioning and electrical repairs.

Canco Collision is a Canadian Automobile Association-approved business and is used for repairs by nine insurance companies, according to Mr. Cole. He says he is proud of the association with those firms.

"You don't build up that type of rapport with these companies unless you are doing something right," he said.
