Teachers' strike brought Cathy here

STOUFFVILLE — Seldom does anyone gain from a strike. But Stouffville did when the teachers of Georgian Bay Secondary School took to the picket line last fall. It brought eighteen-year-old Cathy Davis to S.D.S.S.

Unfortunately, Stouffville's gain and Bognor's loss will soon be reversed. Cathy's returning home this month and will complete her Grade 13 at G.B.S.S. She's our "Girl Next Door."

Formerly of Scarborough, Cathy moved with her parents, Carl and Eleanor Davis, and brother, Robert, to Bognor, 15 miles south-east of Owen Sound, seven years ago.

Cathy resides on a beef farm operated by her father. She's been involved in 4-H, both agriculture and homemaking with 24 projects to her credit. She's also participated in the Queen's Guinea's competition at the Royal Winter Fair.

The teachers' strike in Grey County prompted Cathy's decision to come to Stouffville. Fred and Eleanor Crossen, Church Street South, Cathy's great uncle and aunt, welcomed her warmly.

The feeling is mutual. An honors student at Georgian Bay, (Meaford), Cathy had considerable catching up to do. She made up for lost time by attending Night School at both Stouffville and Aurora. In spite of all the problems, she hopes to maintain her honors standing.

"The teachers here have been very helpful," says Cathy. She explained how Principal John Nikiforuk went out of his way to adjust the timetable to meet her subject requirements.

"Stouffville has a lot of school spirit," says Cathy. "Strangely enough," she and Student Council President Marcy Pyke attended kindergarten together in Scarborough.

Cathy admits the past eight months has been a learning experience in more ways than one. "Living away from home, I grew up quickly," she said. "She feels this will help her bridge the gap between high school and university. A career in school teaching is her choice."

Although Cathy has nothing but praise for the staff and students at S.D.S.S., she's happy to return to Georgian Bay. "A Grade 13 class is always very close," she explains. She wants to be a part of it. She hopes to attend Commencement here this fall to obtain her Grade 12 diploma.

She also hopes to keep in touch with new friends she's made in Stouffville.

This summer, Cathy will again be employed as a Playground Leader with the Owen Sound Parks and Recreation Department. The children
