Students hone musical talents

YORK REGION — Students from York Region chosen to play in the Region's Select Band performed at the Ontario Place Forum on Friday.
The band is made up of Grade 7 and 8 music students who were selected from 27 schools in the Region at auditions held in January. The students attended a three-day camp in Aurora last week which prepared them for a concert in Aurora on Thursday night and for the Forum show.
Lianne Nichols, a Grade 8 student at Orchard Park Public School was chosen as a flutist for the band.

"The camp was a lot of fun and you get to meet a lot of new people and learn a lot of new things," said Lianne.
Bruce Porter, of Boddington Music in Toronto, has been involved with the program since it began.
"After five years of doing this, the performances have become tradition. This band is going to be hard to top," Mr. Porter said.
The band was taught and conducted by Bobby Herriot, President of the Toronto Musicians Association, and Bram Smith, Director of Bands for Humber College.
"I don't know of any two guys who can conduct kids who can't play all that well and produce this," Mr. Porter said. "Anybody can conduct professionals."
Hazel Hodson-Walker, the representative on the Board of Trustees for King Township, has had two sons in this program.
"This band is a fantastic thing," she said.
The band would like to play a concert for the Board of Education at their June 16 meeting.
"We don't get the support from the Board that we'd like," Mr. Porter added. "If they won't come to us, we'll go to them."
