\$30 million business

Hyundai's been harnessed

Always crackerjack with a corporate lasso, Mayor Carole Bell roped Hyundai Canada into Markham's financial corral this week.

Manufacturer of the popular Pony, the Korean-based corporation announced Tuesday it would open a two-phase \$30 million parts distribution centre here.

Markham Industrial Commissioner Alec Barton called the acquisition "a welcome addition to our corporate crowd."

Construction is expected to begin at the Woodbine Ave. and Hwy 7 site this summer and officials hope to occupy the first phase by December.

"I believe Markham offers itself as an incentive," said Mr. Barton. "We don't have to entice corporations with other incentives."

When completed, the centre is expected to create up to 300 jobs and generate \$500,000 in tax revenues annually. Mr. Barton said

Markham's stable tax base and prime location encouraged officials in their decision to locate in the Town.

Hyundai Auto Canada Senior Vice-President Norm Gibbons said they decided on locating in Markham a month ago for the Ontario-wide distribution system.

He said the move will allow Hyundai Auto Canada to consolidate the Ontario distribution system and relocate needed office space.

"We think it will make it a more efficient operation," said Mr. Gibbons. "We're all looking forward to it."

Azure will serve seafood

In 1966, 13 year-old Demetre "Jim" Tryovolas and his family left the small Greek mountain village of Vouvroura and their family-owned cafe for a new life in Canada.

Now at 33, Mr. Tryovolas and three business partners have built upon the success of their first two family restaurants — The Grove and Grove II — by opening a third, aptly named Azure.

Construction on the 150 seat, \$500,000 restaurant began in October 1985 and was completed in March. The restaurant, specializing in fresh seafood dishes, in both name and decor, reminds patrons of the "blue water of the sea," he said.

He admits, however, that he wasn't clear about what type of restaurant it would be until about halfway through the construction period.

"I found myself driving downtown to go to a good restaurant and find this type of cuisine, and then the idea came to me."

He explained that "we undertake projects in a very unsophisticated way sometimes," adding "I am not ashamed to say, I just go with my gut feeling."

Deciding to locate in Markham was also influenced by lower taxes, an affluent population, and the large number of corporations located in the area, he said.

He expects Azure to appeal to a business clientele and those looking for somewhere to spend a special occasion. He is quick to point out that its unique appeal is the seafood which is imported fresh every two days.

"We refuse to serve anything frozen," he said, adding "although frozen salmon, for example, is less than half to buy than the fresh salmon."

Frozen seafood, on the other hand, tends to ferment, he said. "That is why you can always tell the difference in the taste and texture between a frozen item and a fresh one."

The food is prepared by a Portuguese chef, Louis Mendonca and sous-chef Carlos Rovella, a native of Italy. Mr. Tryovolas describes them as "an impressive team."

His future plans include perhaps a fourth restaurant. He is quick to point out, however, that any further growth will be restricted by his ability to maintain a "hands-on approach."

"Right now, I can be at any of our three operations in the time it takes to cook a steak," he laughed. "...no steak can be burned."

Meals per couple, including wine, range from \$30 for lunch to \$60 for dinner. Azure is located at Woodbine Ave. and John St., just north of Steeles.
