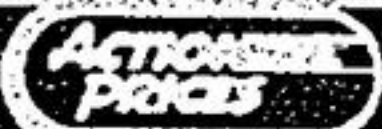

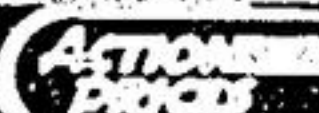

Dad's day is happier now

Markham's Brian Healy wept for himself on a dreary Father's Day in 1983.

His children were there to honor their Dad, who had provided for them for 13 years, but on this Father's Day his children were visitors in his home.

He had separated from his wife two weeks previous to that day and for the first time in his married life did not have her at his side.

Tomorrow, Mr. Healy will look forward to his special day. His shattered emotions have healed, he communicates regularly with his wife Mary and says the relationship he has with his three children is better today than it ever was.

"I've never been closer to my kids," Mr. Healy said at his Lindsay Way townhouse Thursday. "There's a good rapport between us. The whole thing has really brought us together."

Mr. Healy's 13-year-old son Peter lives with his Dad while Lorna, 16 and Jonathan, 8, live in Mt. Albert with their mother. Together, the children spend time with both parents.

He admits he has come a long way since that 'black period' of the break-up and speaks candidly of the joys and heartbreaks of single parenting.

It took him the better part of a year to get off the emotional rollercoaster he unexpectedly found himself on. He believes he's lucky to have had Peter there to share his grief, anger and bitterness. He believes Peter is a best friend as well as a son.

"There are a lot of negative connotations to splitting up," he noted. "People think of the mar-

riage as a failure. I was married for 14 years — I don't consider that a failure."

In the beginning, people he thought were 'solid friends' found it hard to relate with a now-single acquaintance. Those friendships subsequently ended.

Within a year, Mr. Healy found he needed some companionship other than that shared by Peter. He joined the Markham chapter of the One Parent Families Association of Canada and said it's the best thing he ever did.

"It's a great organization run by people who have been there," he noted. "It gives people a chance to meet on the same basis."

His membership there filled an emotional gap the break-up left. Now he has the best of both worlds. He spends time with Peter while also seeing women with

similar interests and backgrounds.

Nowadays, Mr. Healy welcomes the future "with great anticipation." Though he thinks there is no chance for a reconciliation he also believes that things are looking up.

Peter looks forward to taking his Dad to Canadian Tire today to pick out some fishing gear for Father's Day. The pair plan to head to the north country and catch a few in the next two weeks.

Reflecting, Mr. Healy still has mixed emotions about the break down and subsequent readjustment his whole family had to face. But he believes that life goes on regardless and he faced it.

"The early part is the hardest but people shouldn't feel they have to prove anything to anybody," he said.

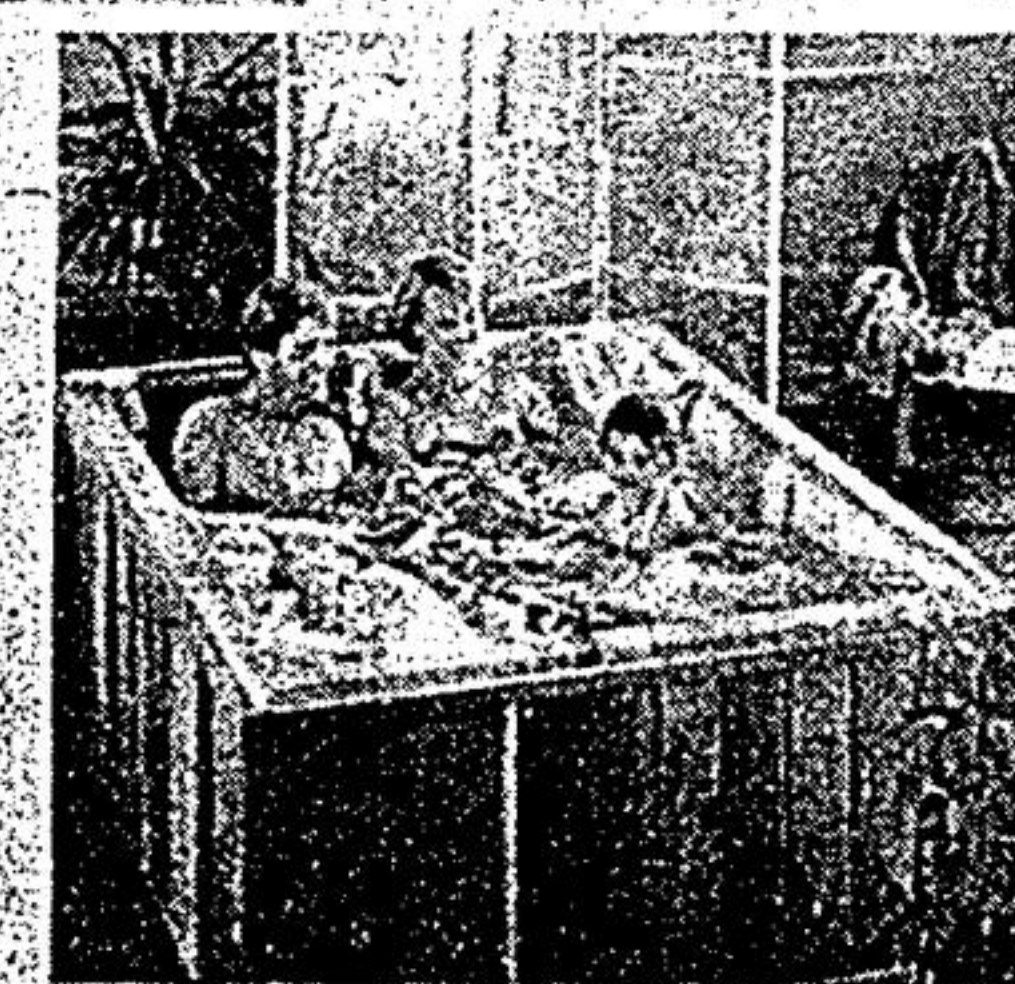
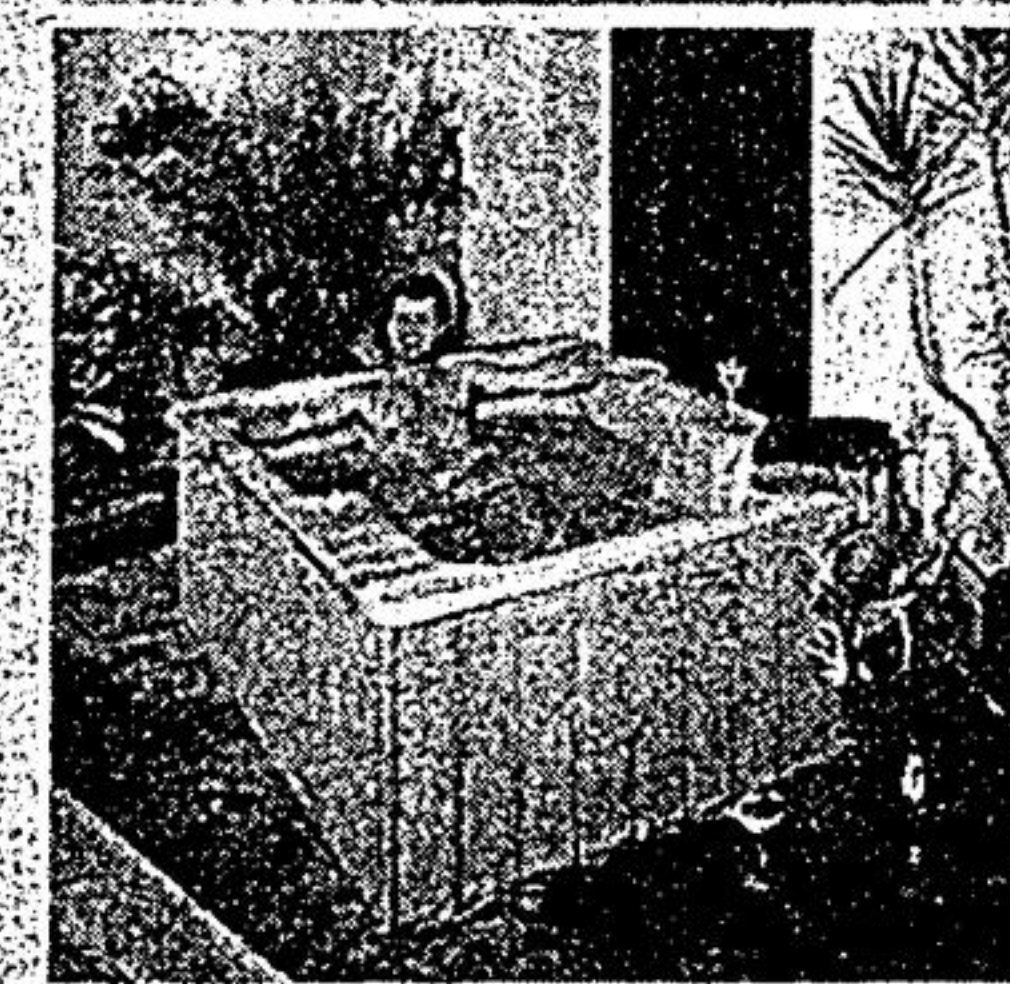
