TV program on local lad

Eight-year-old Andrew (Drew) Smyth's lifelong fight against a birth defect has raised the interest of CFTO-TV.

The Toronto television station has produced a short television segment on the Markham lad, illustrating his fight against a congenital heart defect. The segment will appear on television tomorrow during CFTO's Hospital for Sick Children telethon.

A story on Drew first appeared in the Economist and Sun last February, prior to his final open-heart operation to repair and reconstruct vessels in his heart.

Entitled 'A Special Place', Drew's story will include a history of his condition that led to world-renowned cardiologist Robert Freedom's decision to perform the corrective procedure.

Eight different segments about children will also be shown from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. tomorrow.

Jury picked for trial

WHITBY — Jury selection for the hockey assault trial of a Pickering teen who's charged with kicking a Stouffville player in the neck will begin on Sept. 29, ruled Judge W.B. Lane at Whitby District Court last Wednesday.

Rod Kammerer of Pickering was charged with two counts of criminal assault after the incident during a hockey game at Uxbridge Arena last November, which left Shawn Leonard with a two-and-a-half inch gash under his chin.

Leonard and Kammerer, both 18 at the time, became involved in a scuffle during a Junior B game between Uxbridge (Leonard's team) and Pickering (Kammerer's team).

Evidence to be presented at the trial will include photos taken of Leonard's chin shortly after Uxbridge physician Dr. Terry Bryon stitched him up. Dr. Bryon's written statement will also be submitted as evidence in the trial.

Kammerer and his lawyer were present at the pre-trial but Leonard did not appear.

IMPORTANT SECOND NOTICE

The Regional Municipality of York, who are responsible for the supply of water and sewage treatment for the area Municipalities, have advised us that costs will be further increased on January 1, 1986, under the terms of existing agreements with the Ministry of the Environment (Ontario) and Metropolitan Toronto. Unfortunately, it is necessary for us to pass on these increases to our consumers. This will constitute notice that, effective JANUARY 1, 1986, your new rates are as follows:
