Three more victories have upped the Markham baseball Midgets' unbeaten season record to 8-0.

Wednesday night the club used pitcher Philip Daniels' two batters to blast Bolton 7-1. The big inning came in the fifth when Nigel Stewart blasted a three-run homer. Stewart was the offensive star, going 4-for-4 at the plate.

One night earlier another three-run fifth-inning spurge broke a 2-2 tie and powered Markham past Stouffville 5-2. Bruce Thomson and catcher Rick Smythe had two hits apiece.

Two hit performances by Daniels, Thomson, Albert Tan and Craig Macinnis set up four runs in the fifth and helped Markham down Thornhill 10-3.

A Midget tournament in Kincardine saw the

locals reach the consolation finals before bowing out 7-4 to Bowmanville.

Markham started with a 4-3 extra-innings loss, then rebounded to trample Rexdale 14-3. Smythe led the defensive effort by picking off two runners and nabbing another two trying to steal.

In the final, Bowmanville jumped into an early lead and Markham couldn't regain the lost ground.

Back in league action, the Midgets won game five with an 11-6 decision over Tottenham.

Sparking the win were strong fifth and sixth innings. The club was ahead by only one run, but the catalyst came when it executed a perfect triple play between Stewart, Smith and Tan. Stewart and Tan also led the offensive side, with three hits apiece. Ric Hastings and Rob Parsons helped out with two each.
