Unionville boys win consolation

York/Durham Softball League opponents continue to be fodder for Unionville's North Markham Honda Peeewe winning machine.

The squad collected three wins last week, blanking Port Perry 4-0, then slipping past Aurora 8-7 and Claremont 4-3.

Pitcher Russell Herrington tossed 11 strikeouts and gave up only two hits in the Port Perry triumph. But the contest was close in that Unionville had only four hits. Steel Barrett's two RBIs made the difference.

Unionville managed to beat Aurora with a 10-hit offence that made up for pitcher Ryan Robinson giving up 13 walks in less than five innings.

Still, Robinson was no slouch at the plate, scoring three times on three hits (including a triple).

Herrington and Jamie Burton (who had a two RBIs) smashed two hits apiece. Brent Lawson scored twice and Bob Speers also had two RBIs.

The Claremont win saw Herrington help his own 10-strikeout performance on the mound by scoring twice on a double and a homer. Robinson and Barrett also had two hits apiece.

Last weekend the club put together a strong enough performance to win the consolation title at a Gravenhurst tournament.

In game one the locals ran up against a hot throwing and batting pitcher, who shut them down 8-1. Brent Lawson had the lone
