Scotia Bank manager retires plans new career in finance

 STOUFFVILLE — Paul Roney, the soon-to-retire manager of Stouffville's Bank of Nova Scotia, plans to take it easy for awhile, then it's back into the world of finance.

Mr. Roney intends starting up his own financial consulting firm that he'll operate from his house on 9th Line North.

For the time being, however, he plans to relax and work on improving his golf game. This week he's holidaying at a cottage near Fort William.

After 36 years with the bank, Mr. Roney feels it's time to move on to something else. "It's a long time to be in one business," he says.

Mr. Roney began his banking career in 1950, immediately after graduating from High School in Ottawa. His first position was that of Junior Clerk.

He then moved up to teller and later, an accountant.

His first posting as manager took him to Spanish, Ont., a small town between Sudbury and Sault Ste. Marie. "It was an unorganized town," Paul recalls, "the parish priest and I practically ran it ourselves."

He remained there three years before moving to a branch in Whitby. After four years there, Mr. Roney was transferred to the

Stouffville branch in 1971.

"This is our first home," says Mr. Roney, "and Ottawa is our second."

A lot of changes have taken place in the banking business during the career of Mr. Roney. When he first began, ledgers were done by hand. They're now done by computers and all branches were open Saturdays. "It's like we're going backwards now. More and more branches are opening on Saturdays again," Mr. Roney said.

"I've always enjoyed banking," he continued, "it's very interesting and I obtain a real sense of satisfaction from it."

Mr. Roney has enjoyed working in small towns. "You get to know all your customers personally," he said.

"In a small town, being a bank manager is almost like running your own business," he added.

Mr. Roney and wife Louise have two sons: Christopher, now 27, graduated from Stouffville Dist. Secondary School and is currently working towards his degree in Psychology. Patrick, 17, is a Grade 12 student at Sacred Heart High School, Newmarket.

When he entered into bank management, and began moving from place to place, Mr. Roney joined the Lion's Club. He found this very helpful whenever he and his family took up residence in a new community. He's Past-President and a 20-year Lions member.

Mr. Roney is also a member of the Chamber of Commerce; Chairman of the Library Board and Treasurer of the Downtown Business Improvement Association.

"I've always enjoyed participating in the community," he said.

Mr. Roney's retirement from the Bank of Nova Scotia becomes official August 1.
