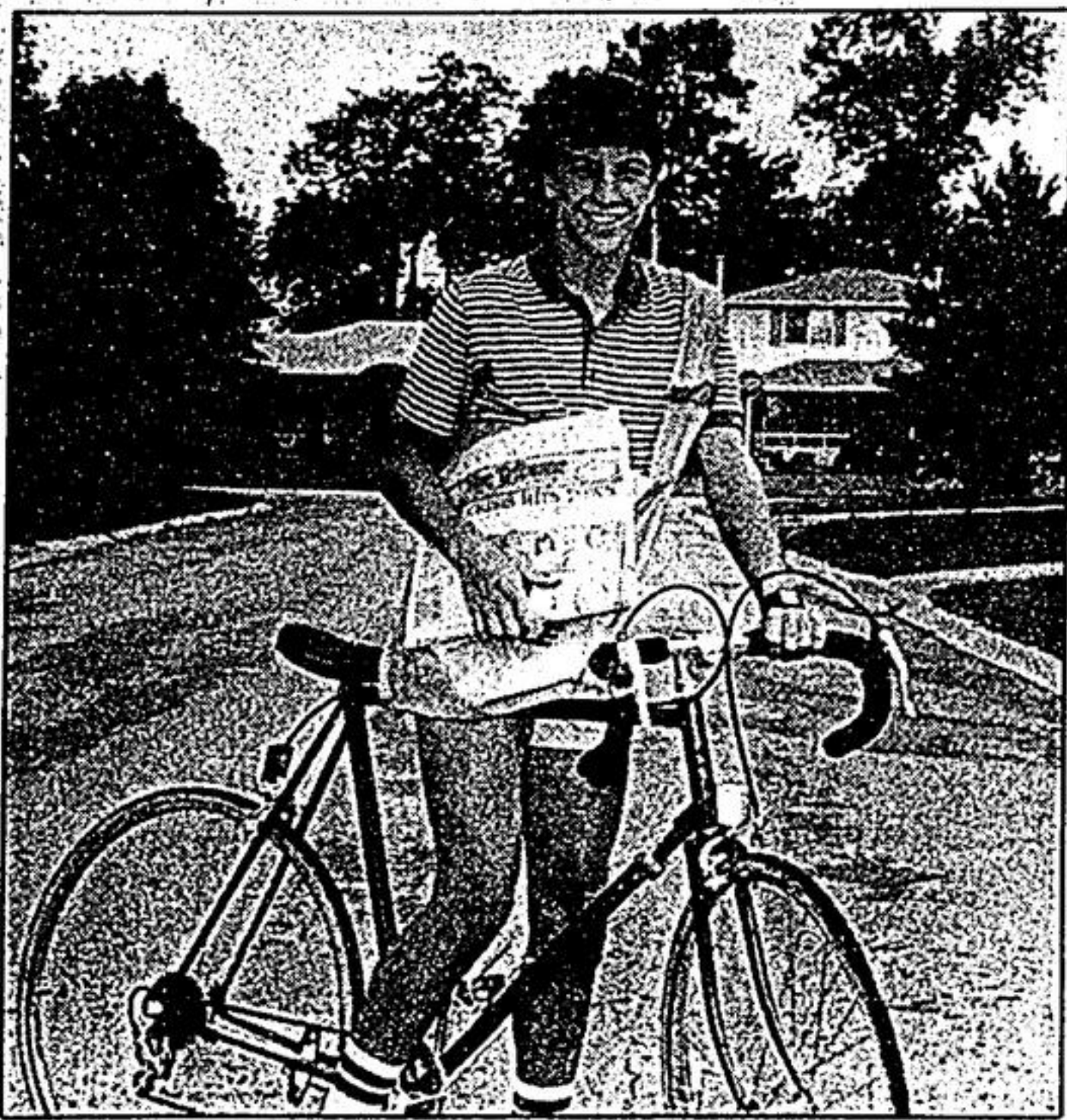
Young people 13 to 18 years of age are invited. The starting time is 8 p.m. The dance concludes at 11:30.
