## Mission a success

STOUFFVILLE .- For 3 period of almost two weeks. 'Team Renaissance', a group of twelve young people from the Pentecostal Churches of Stouffville and Markham, took their team ministry to the streets of Vancouver.

While there, they had an opportunity to visit Expo.'86. However, the main purpose of the visit was to reach out to both natives and visitors in various sections of the city.

'Renaissance' was posted in the gastown district, not unlike Harbourfront in Toronto; Sherry Yeates of Goodwood told The Tribune. A section, however, is part of Vancouv-'er's skid-row, and this is where they concentrated much of their efforts.

"For some of our listening audience it was entertainment," Sherry explained, "for others, it was a thoughtprovoking message." Because of the noise and the busyness of the area, the music had a greater impact than the speaking skits.

For Sherry, the one-on-one approach was best of all; even though sometimes a little

"A few resented it," she said, "but the majority were

very friendly." Some of the people they

met, (on several occasions the same people every day), had reached 'rock bottom', Sherry said. The group shared sandwiches with them and they seemed very appreciative of this, she explained.

"Really terrific," is the way she described the experience. "Vancouver knew there were Christians in town."

Sherry said she knew of many conversions including two members of a Canadian Indian family.

In a city the size of Vancouver, most people erect a wall of resistance around themselves, explained Sherry. For some, it's three feet thick and for others, it's only three inches thick. Breaking through this wall is the hard part, she said. Often, the person 'inside'

is very friendly. Sherry described the 'mission' as challenging and re-warding. She said taking God's Word to the people was an experience she'd never forget...

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


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
