





Minister defends Co-op firm

The fertilizer plant at Cedar Valley, operated by the United Co-operatives, is in the news again. The site was recently the subject of discussion by Whitchurch-Stouffville Council, prompting a letter to the Ministry of the Environment.

A reply from the Minister, Hon. James Bradley, states:

Dear Mrs Hallam:

In response to the motion of the Council of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, staff from my Central Region Office visited the United Co-operatives fertilizer plant in Cedar Valley.

The attachment to your May 16 letter indicates a resident adjacent to the plant is concerned with the storage of anhydrous ammonia gas on the property. Our inspector reported this product has not been handled at this location for approximately five years.

The facility receives dry bulk materials and produces standard concentrations and custom blends of fertilizer. There are also two storage tanks of a liquid fertilizer known as UAN that contains 28 percent nitrogen. This product is not the anhydrous ammonia gas mentioned in the attachment. The area around the two liquid fertilizer storage tanks is protected by a containment berm.

My Ministry considers the products at the Cedar Valley United Co-operatives to be stored properly. In addition, a product record has been provided to the Stouffville Fire Department for contingency purposes.
