# One-stop shopping coming to Milliken

One-stop shopping will soon make its presence known in Milliken — Super Centre is coming.

Construction crews are currently working on the 100,000 sq. ft. shopping complex that will anchor the community's first covered mall.

Other stores scheduled for occupancy in the mall include Willy Wonderful, Swiss Chalet and Harvey's Hamburgers, according to Ward 8 Councillor Alex Chiu.

The fourth Super Centre to open in Ontario, officials expect the Kennedy Rd. and Denison St. project to be completed this October.

"It's just great, we'll have something within walking distance," said Mr. Chiu. "Everyone in the ward is very happy about it."

And officials at Super Centre, owned by Combined Merchandis-

ers Inc. (CMI), agree that the facility will be well used by Milliken residents.

CMI President Ted Johnston said the newest location will meet the growing shopping demands of Milliken's growing community.

"The Milliken population certainly does have a need for a Super Centre in the community," said Mr. Johnston on Monday. "All the things they need on a regular basis will be located at the mall."

## Toronto Area Rail Transportation of Dangerous Goods Task Force

A special task force has been formed by the Minister of Transport, to examine the flow of dangerous goods through the Toronto area rail network, which covers Metropolitan Toronto and the regional municipalities of Durham, York, Peel and Halton.

All interested groups or individuals are asked to submit written briefs on the transportation of dangerous goods by rail. These submissions should include such aspects as re-routing, re-location, or additional safety measures for the existing rail network. The deadline for briefs is November 30, 1986.

Public hearings will take place in mid-1987, during which interested parties will be given an opportunity to discuss the issues and interim findings of the task force.
