Baseball Bantams contrary to weather

Markham's Mr. D boys didn't let last week's foul weather stop them from playing some fine ball. But when the sun returned, their performance turned foul.

Markham trounced an all-star team from Toronto City Playgrounds 12-6 in the first rain-drenched game at the 26th annual Scarborough Bantam Baseball Tournament.

Both teams scored a run in their first at-bat and Toronto scored five times in the fourth inning to take a 6-3 lead.

But the locals struck for three runs in their half of the fourth, and crossed the plate six more times over the next two frames to put the game on ice and advance to the championship round.

Tim Welker led the 8-hit Markham attack, going for 3-for-4 at the plate. Ryan McIntyre picked up a single and a double, while singles went to Todd McDowell, John Hill and Paul Smith.

In the next game, played under sunny skies, North York clobbered the locals 17-7 in an annihilation ended by the mercy rule.

Markham went into the third frame with a 1-1 tie, but North York collected six runs as a result of two Markham errors.

The locals fought back to tie the score in the fourth, but in the fifth they fell apart as North York scored 10 times on four Markham walks and three errors.

Chris Lamarre, McDowell and Smith bagged two hits apiece in the losing effort.

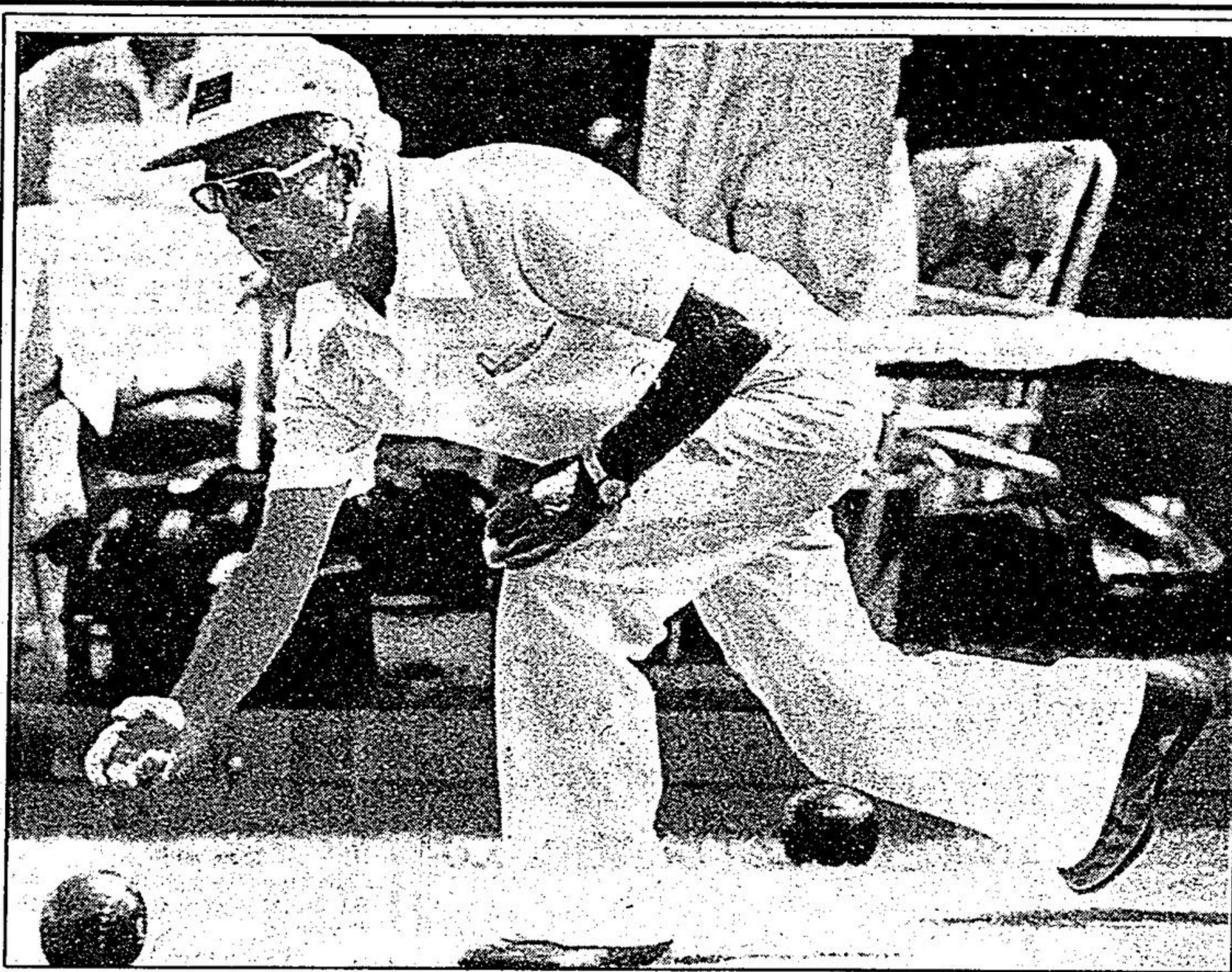

Jon Retter led the offense with a homer and four RBIs, while Brent Lawson and Steel Barrett chalked up three hits each.

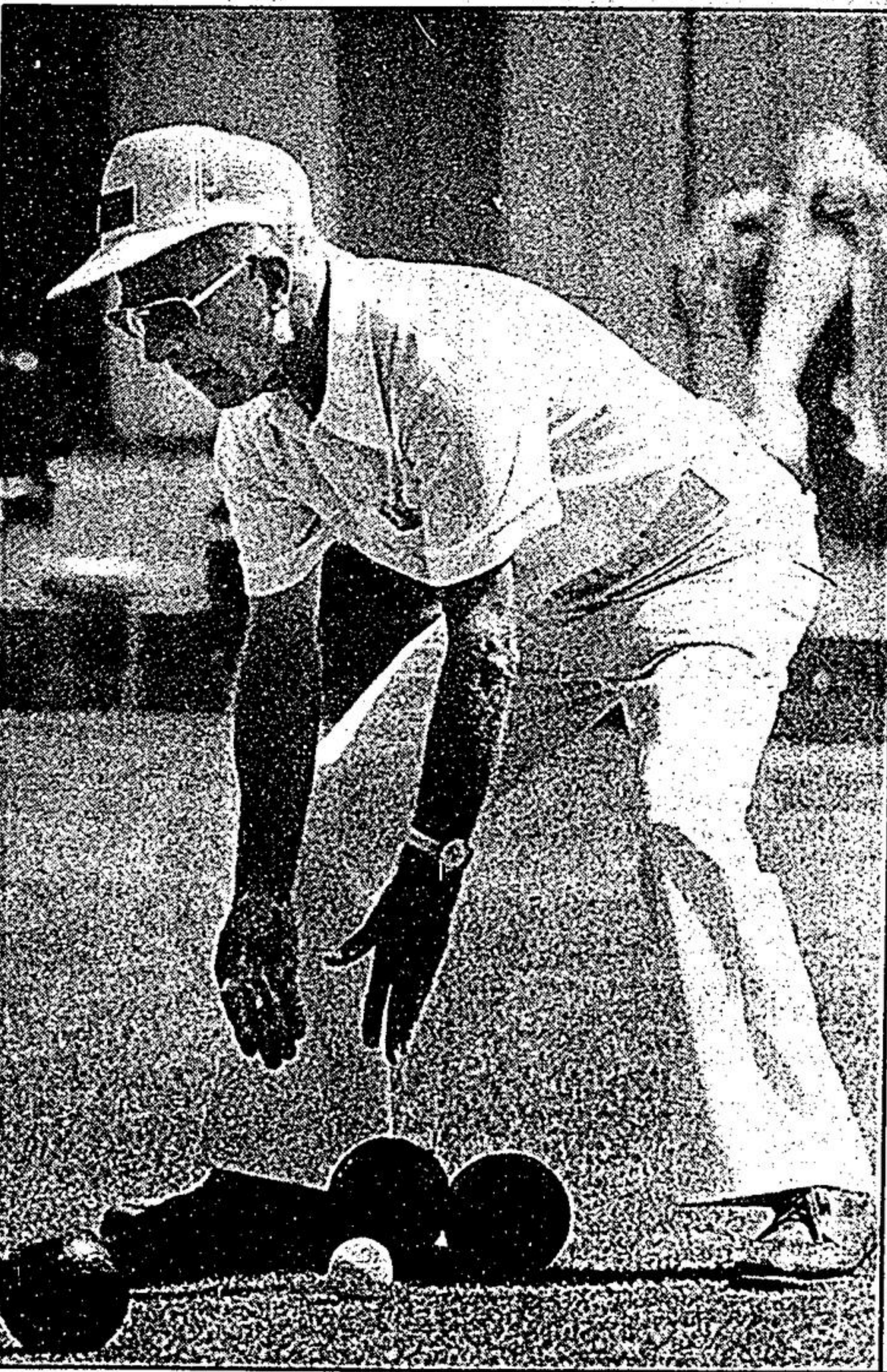
Ryan Robinson and Greg Pipher collected an RBI apiece in the team's road victory.
