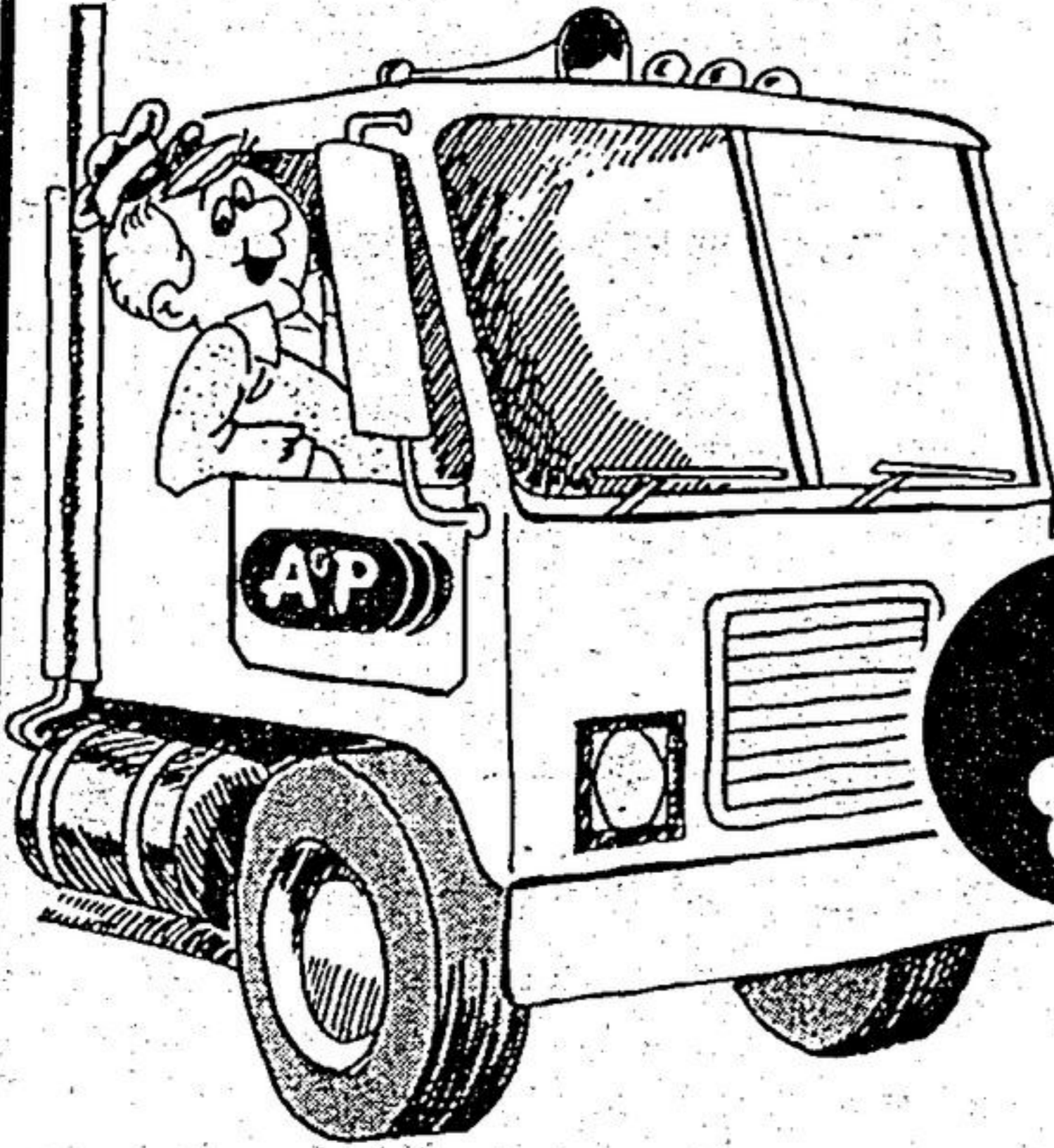
The newly renovated Images (in the lower level of the Old Town Hall in Markham) will be featuring Top 40s music and the goldie oldies tonight.
