Zaire used to be known as the Belgian Congo, but gained its independence in 1960. The country is just north of the equator and consists of tropical rain forest and grasslands. The average temperature is 80 degrees Fahrenheit.

The country's official language is French and Tony will be taking a one-week immersion course in Quebec before he begins the exchange. He hopes to have a good working knowledge of the language by the time he returns to Canada in March.

The Markham District High School graduate turned down acceptances at several universities to participate in this nonprofit program.

When he returns home for good, he hopes to have a better idea of what he wants to learn and a broader perspective that comes from experience.




