

Planning agenda full after recess

STOUFFVILLE — The Town's planning advisory committee returned to a busy agenda Aug. 19 following a lengthy summer recess.

Among proposals outlined at the meeting was the redevelopment of Stouffville Christian School onto a 5.1-hectare (12.5-acre) parcel located on Hwy. 47, north of the Deer Park Inn.

The plan, which also includes a commercial/industrial complex, was referred to a future planning session.

In another separate delegation, Keith Acton presented plans for a 21-lot residential subdivision on Mill Street.

Appearing on behalf of his family, he said the Actons would like to proceed with development of the site when sewage and water capacity becomes available.

Members of Whitechurch-Stouffville's planning committee stood firm on an earlier decision not to allow the establishment of a service station at the corner of

Stouffville and McCowan Roads. Applicant Frank Fiore claimed he checked with residents neighboring the proposed site and found they have no objections to such a facility.

However, Mayor Fran Sainsbury told the proponent that his project is not compatible with the type of growth designated for the portion of Stouffville Road between Ringwood and Hwy. 404.

During the final delegation of the evening, town lawyer Gord

Ness came under fire from some councillors for the manner in which he addressed the committee.

"I want to know who's running this town? Is it Council, or is it being run on the whim of the engineers?" Mr. Ness demanded on behalf of client Ray Hill. He was concerned about engineering consultant costs for a preliminary road design study for a Hillsdale Road property.

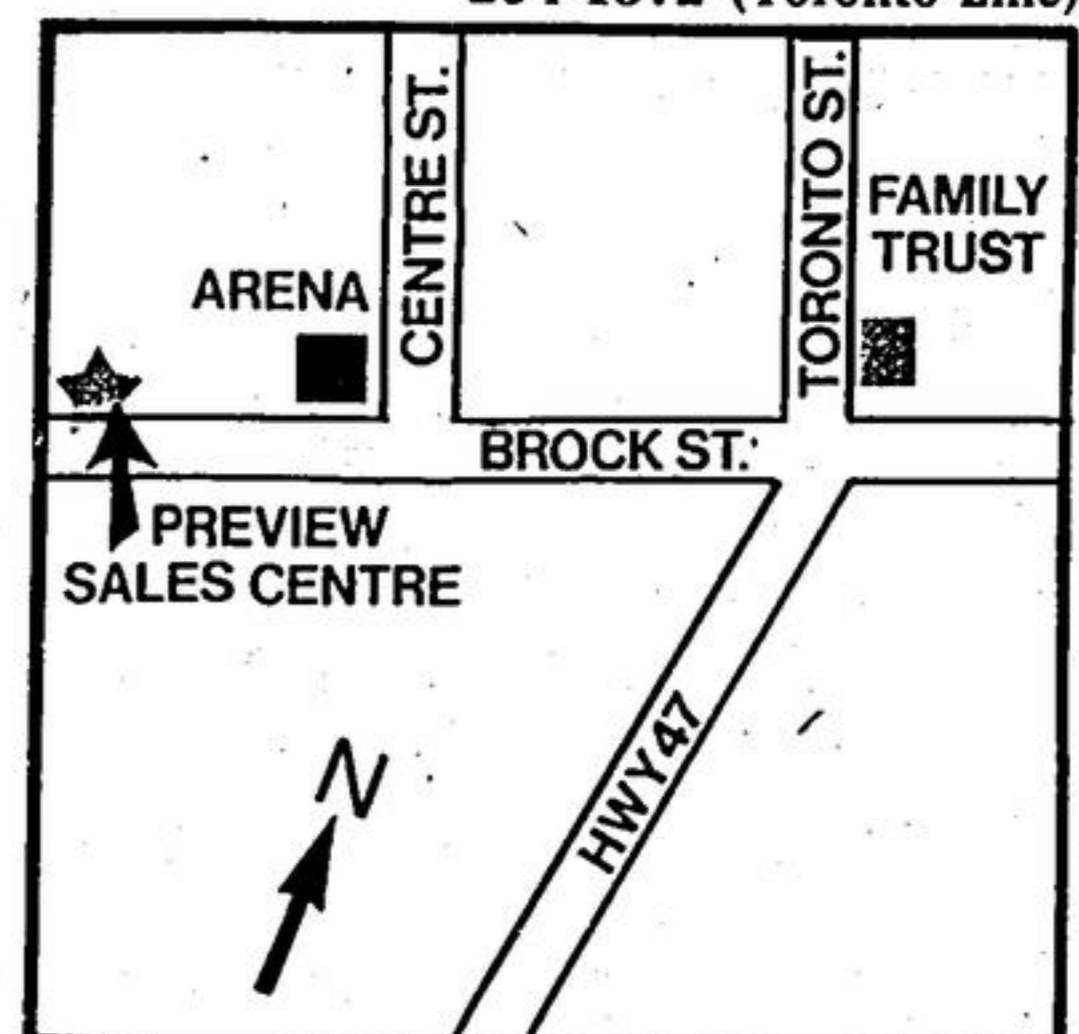
