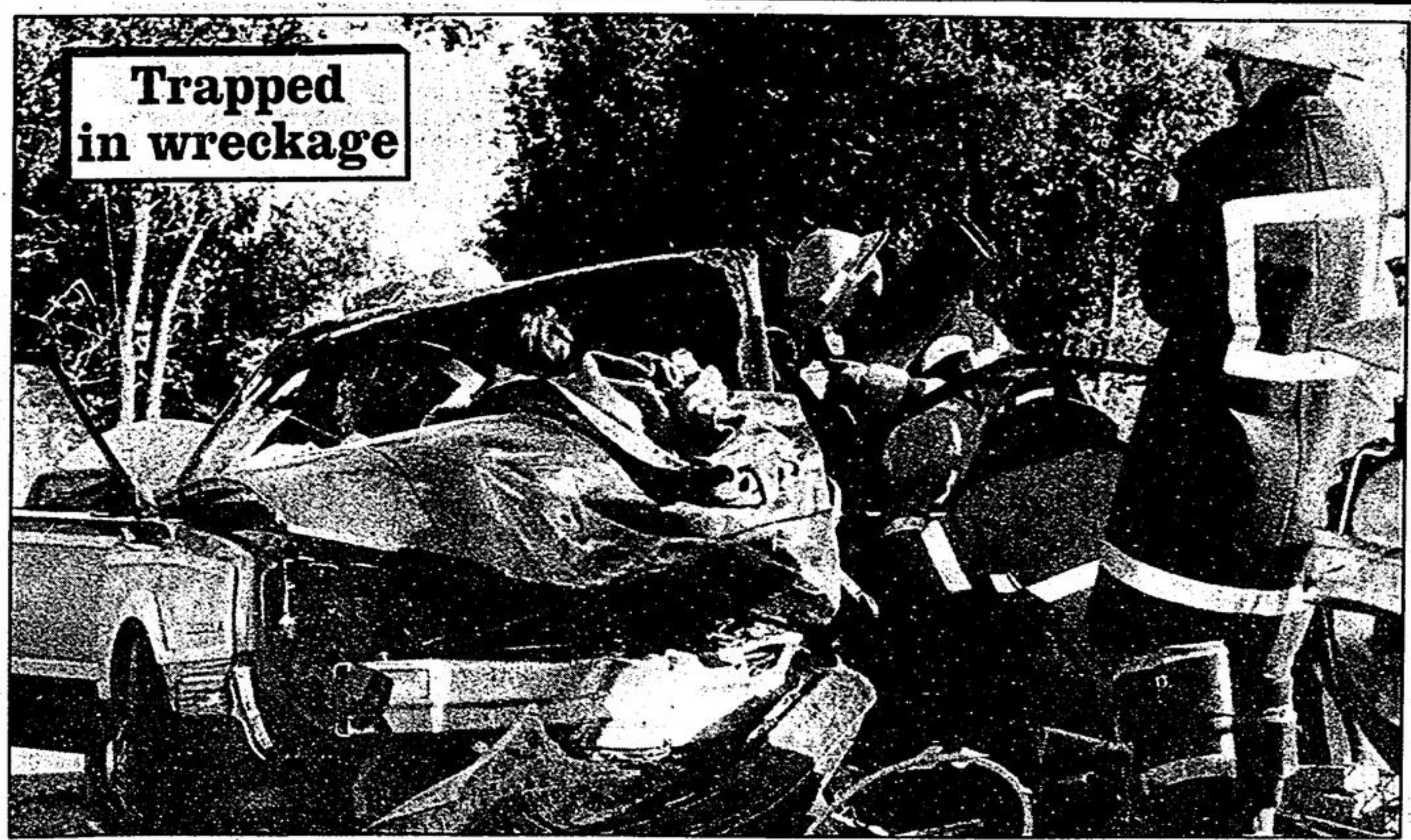


Trapped in wreckage



Emergency crews worked for nearly two hours Sunday to pry two men from the twisted wreckage of their cars following a late-afternoon crash on Durham Region Road 5 (Conc. 9), east of Claremont. According to Durham Regional Police, Frank Spatz, 25, of Zephyr was driving his 1977 Volkswagen Rabbit westbound on Conc. 9 when he met head-on with an eastbound 1986 Pontiac stationwagon driven by 61-year-old Michael Field of Oshawa. Spatz was taken via air ambulance to Sunnybrook Medical Centre, where he remains in critical condition with head and internal injuries. Field is being treated at Scarborough Centenary Hospital for multiple fractures and internal injuries. Police continue to investigate the cause of the 5 p.m. crash.

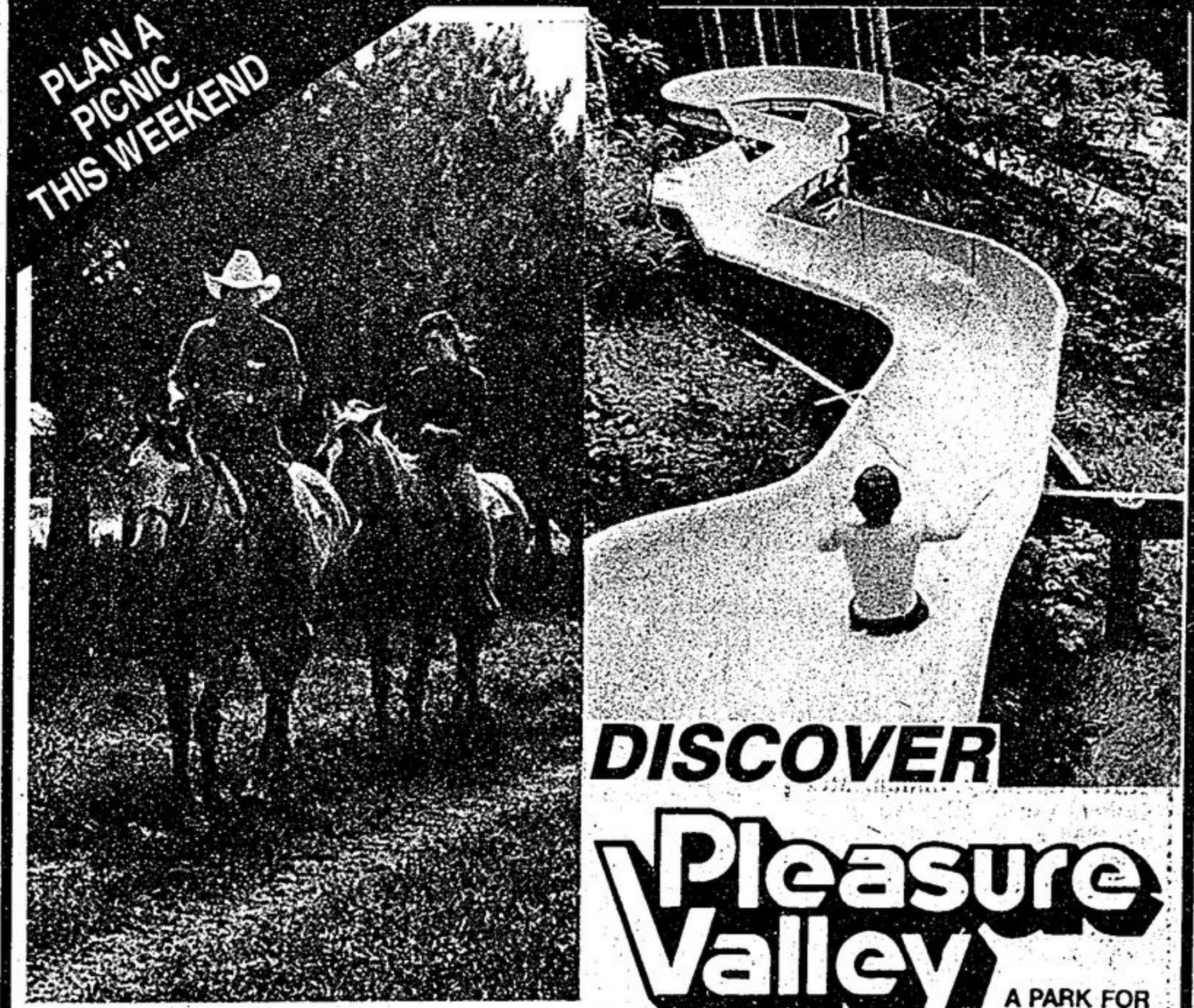
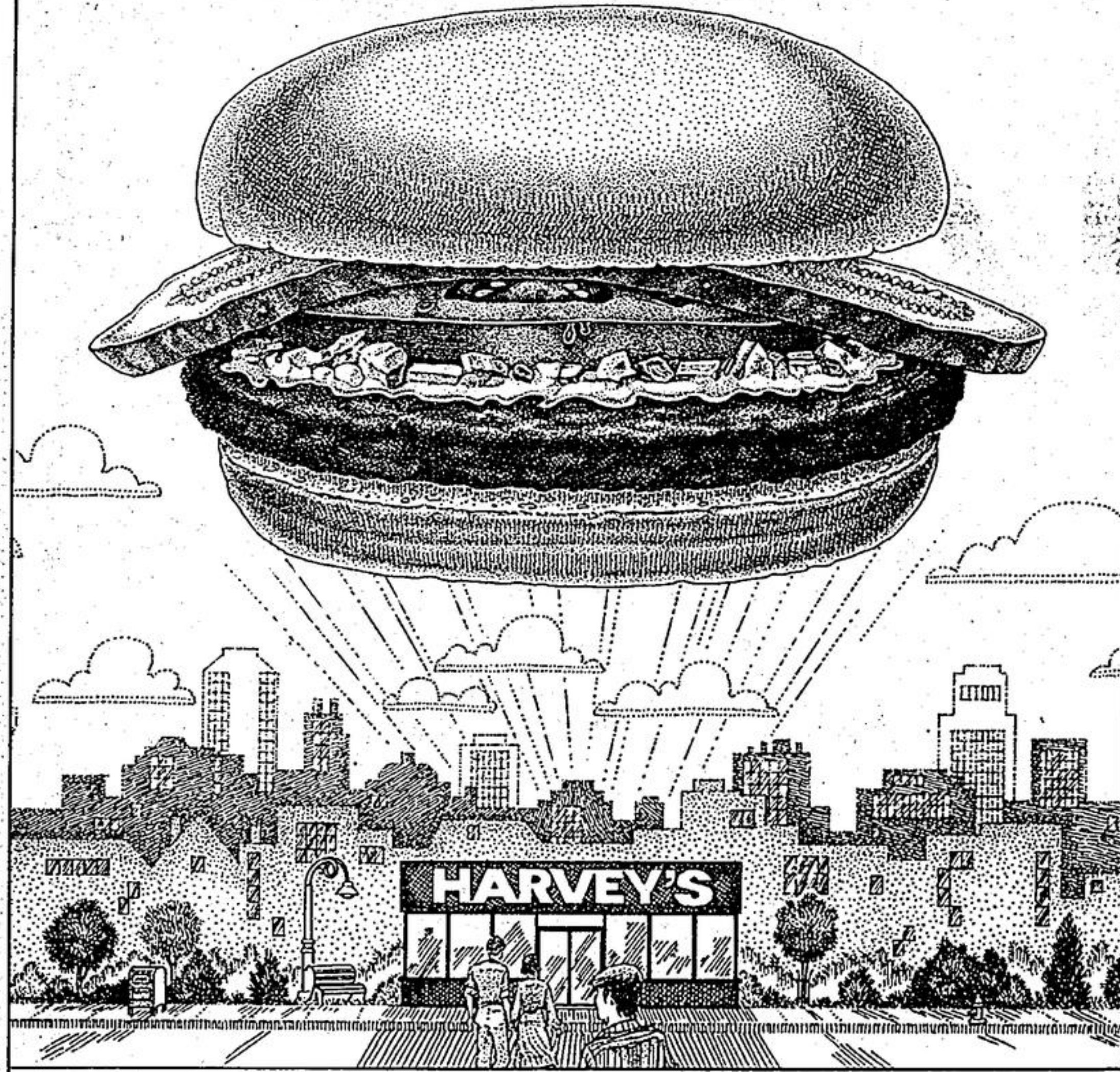

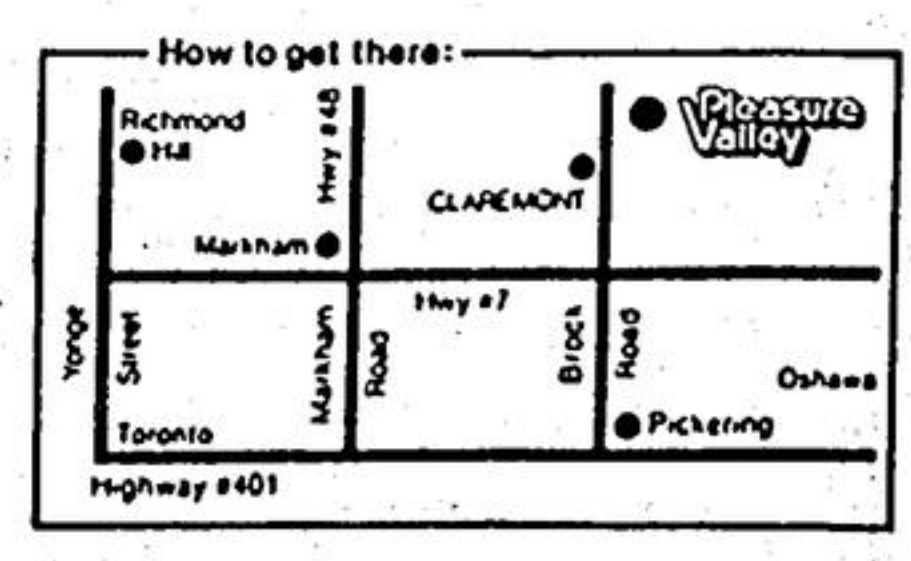
