MARKHAM—To-day a field; to-morrow a sanctuary.

The reality of this vision had its beginning, Sunday, with the turning of the first sod at the site of the new Markham Missionary Church.

The location is 17th Avenue, east of McCowan Road. The property was donated by Jack and Pat Warriner.

Rev. Grant Sloss, the congregation's pastor, called it "an exciting day."

The contract, in excess of \$1 million, has been awarded to Don Hawkey Construction Limited of Wasaga Beach, the same firm that built St. Mark's Catholic Church and Springvale Baptist Church in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

The present sanctuary on Main Street North, Markham, has been purchased by Mar Thoma Church of Toronto.

Participants in the sod-turning ceremony included: Rev. Sloss; Associate Pastor Myles Toop; Dan Whitham, Chairman of the Board; Regional Councillor Ron Moran and Ward 6 Councillor Elson Miles.

Special music for the service was rendered by Michael and Colette Warriner, and Dave Kennedy.

It was near there Mrs Moyer, the former Jennie Hoover was born, daughter of Simeon and Josephine (Stouffer) Hoover. She attended the old Dickson's Hill School now re-located at Black Creek Pioneer Village, and Markham High School. Later, she married Roy Moyer and together they raised a family of four daughters and two sons.

Mrs Moyer was extremely proud of her children—Eleanor at Thunder Bay; Katherine, (Mrs Clarence McDowell), Markham; Margaret, (Mrs John Hawkins), R.R. 1, Gormley; Lillian, (Mrs Robert McDowell), Uxbridge; Warren and Willard, both of Dickson's Hill.

There are two sisters, Flora, (Mrs Elmore Barkey), R.R. 2, Markham; Edith, (Mrs Reg Gibbins), Stouffville; 19 grandchildren and 25 great-grandchildren.

Mrs Moyer passed away Aug. 16 in Parkview Home, Stouffville, where she'd been a resident 13 years. She was 93.

Skyview Farms at Dickson's Hill was also the home of the Moyer's fine herd of Guernsey cattle. In addition to the work involved there, Mr and Mrs Moyer attended North York Market every Saturday. Mrs Moyer's jams, jellies and home-made bread found ready sale with city buyers.

Mrs Moyer was an active supporter of the Markham Twp. Sunday School Association. She also belonged to the Dickson's Hill Sewing Circle. During the War, she was continually knitting scarves and socks for shipment overseas.

Later, a new house was built on a section of the farm property, fronting on Old Hwy. 48. Mr and Mrs Moyer resided there about ten years.

Together, they enjoyed several pleasant trips out West and to Florida.

Mrs Moyer was a member of the Dickson's Hill Missionary Church. She also attended at Stouffville Missionary Church where the funeral service was held Aug. 19. Participating pastors included: Rev. Jim Clubine, Rev. Ed Sparks and Rev. Arthur Walsh.

Pall-bearers were: Martin McDowell, Glen Michaelis, Richard Hawkins, David Moyer, Jonathon Moyer and Paul Moyer. Interment was made at Dickson's Hill Cemetery.
