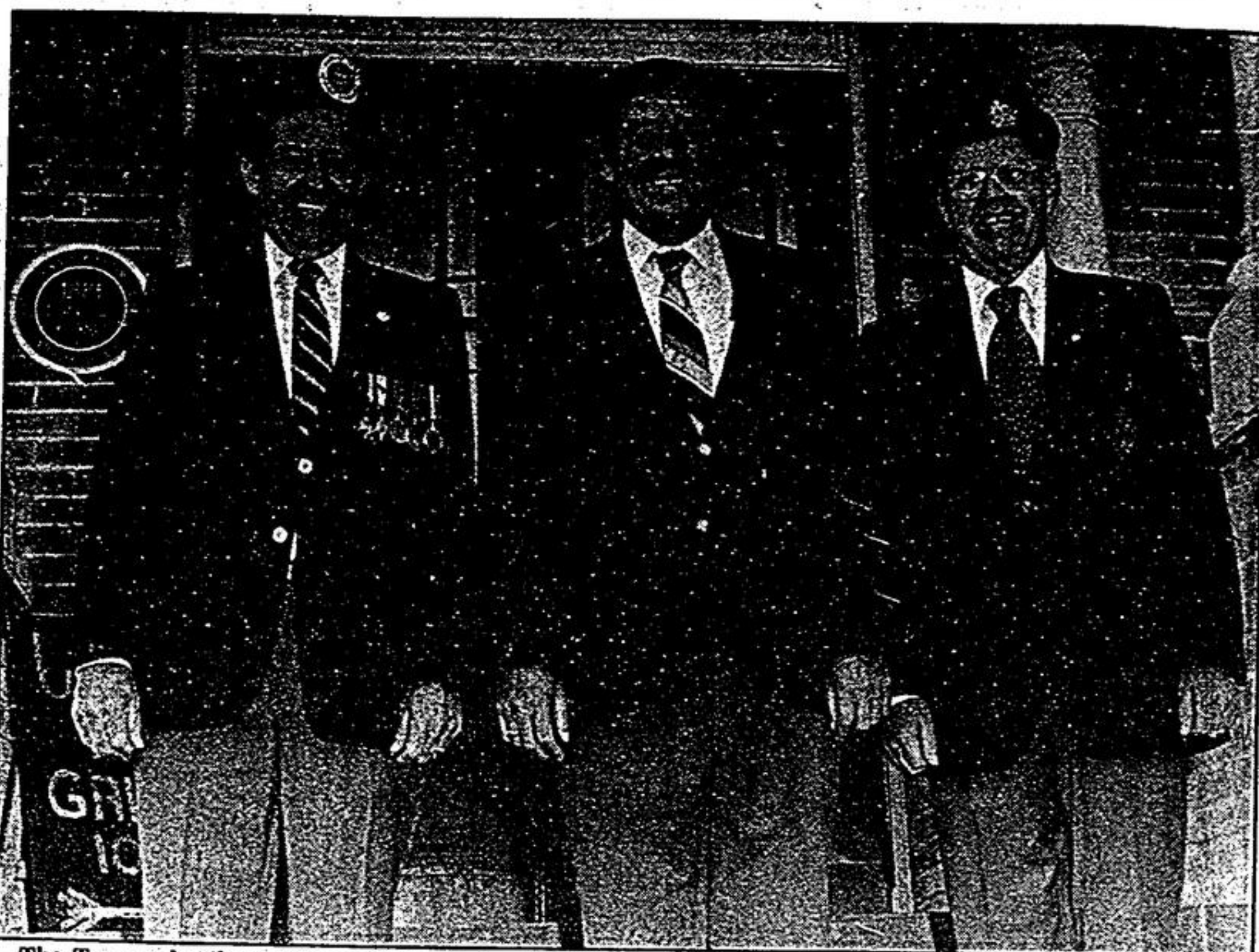


Markham vets hold reunion

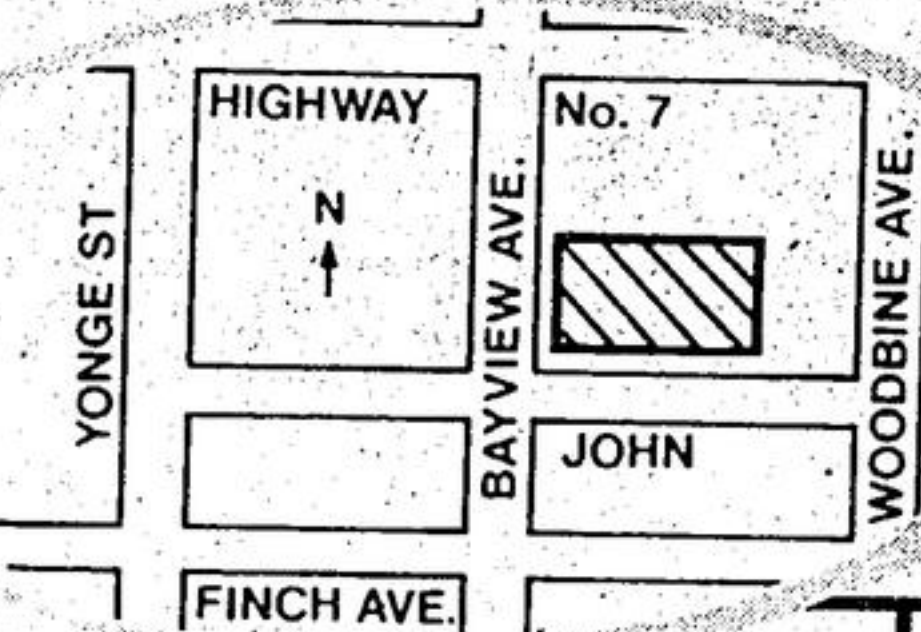

History repeats itself

MARKHAM — They came from across the country and met on the steps of the old Town Hall, just as they did 40 years ago.

For it was Oct. 1, 1946, that a group of veterans returned from World War II and held a meeting on Main Street.

Out of that discussion, it was agreed to establish what is now the Markham District Veterans' Association with headquarters on Washington Street.

To celebrate the historic occasion, Bob Lawrie, Erlane Avenue, and John Lunau, 16th Avenue, put their heads together and decided to organize a reunion.

It was held Saturday and proved one of the most successful events Markham has seen in years.

More than 80 vets, some from distant points in Ontario and even the southern United States, returned to their old home town.

Life Memberships were presented by the Association. Engraved pins were donated by Council.

Organizers Bob Lawrie and John Lunau addressed the assembly. Other speakers included brothers Tom and Bob Burns; Jack Harris and Regional Councillor Ron Moran.

Tom Burns, now of Mississauga, noted a few of the many changes that have taken place in the former Village in the last half-century. "Our church is gone; the rink is gone and even the high school, (where I attended occasionally), is no more," he said.

While some expressed regret at the passing of certain 'institutions', all praised the 'new look' of Markham's Main Street.

Enthusiastic applause was accorded Bob Lawrie and John Lunau, the reunion's chief organizers. A formal photograph of the group will be preserved for posterity in the Markham Museum.

Arson suspected in blaze

PINE ORCHARD — A recent fire, that caused an estimated \$100,000 damage to a house at the corner of the 5th Concession, (Warden Avenue), and the Vivian Sideroad, may have been deliberately set.

That's the opinion of police although a report from the Fire Marshal's Office hasn't been received.

The house, owned by Andrew and Ronald McPhail of Whitechurch-Stouffville, wasn't occupied at the time of the blaze. It was being rented to Kevin Dignard of R.R. 3, Newmarket.
