New principal 'approachable'

GOODWOOD - Incoming Goodwood Public School principal Wayne Burnett is impressed with both the students and staff at his new posting.

"I find the kids very well mannered, polite and they seem willing to do things with you," Mr. Burnett said in an interview. "I think there is a real closeness of spirit with these kids."

And from what he has seen so far, "the entire staff are a very

dedicated bunch."

Mr. Burnett, who replaces new Uxbridge Public School principal Richard Hannah at Goodwood, plans no major changes to start.

"The approach I'm taking is to be very approachable," he explained. "If parents want to come in, the school is open to them. The staff and students are also welcome to approach me at any time."

The 17-year Durham Board of

Education veteran said he tries to emphasize the positive aspects of education.

"I always try to catch a student doing something good," Mr. Burnett explained, adding that he has asked staff to keep him informed of any positive accomplishments.

In an attempt to get to know the school's approximately 175 students, Mr. Burnett plans to become involved in a variety of activities. He's now helping help

coach the cross-country and track and field teams along with staff member Tessie Dempster.

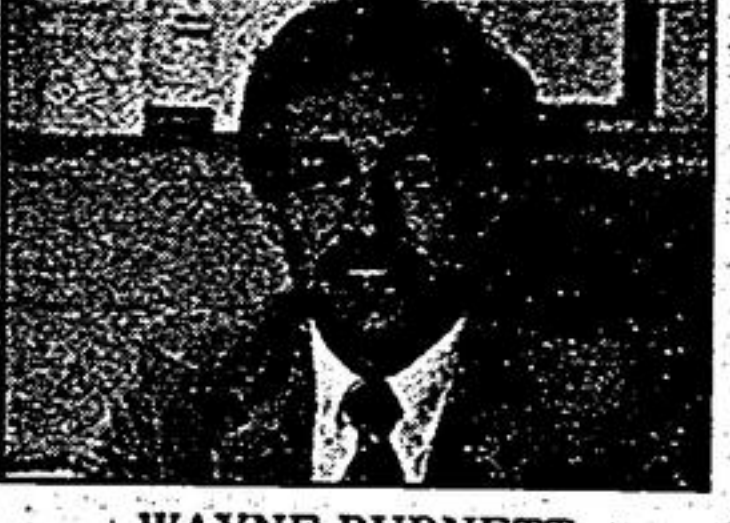
"I get the chance to know them and they know me," the principal said.

Aside from his administrative duties, Mr. Burnett will also teach Grade 5 and 6 mathematics.

"I'm looking forward to a good, long stay here," noted the 40-year-old educator, who lives in Whitby with his wife Lynn and their daughters Courtney, 8, and Hilary, 7.

His past board experience includes four years as vice-principal at Oshawa's Lake Vista Senior Public School plus a stint at Prince Albert/Raglan.

Mr. Burnett's not the only newcomer at Goodwood for the 1986-87 school term. He's joined on staff by teachers Anne Strutt (Gr. 2/3), Jane Sobel (Gr. 3/4) and Ron Brittain (Gr. 4/5).
