



## Residents ready to run for Terry

UXBRIDGE — Uxbridge will join other communities across Canada on Sunday, Sept. 14 for the annual 10-kilometre Terry Fox Run.

Pledge forms are available at the Family Trust Real Estate office (at the corner of Brock and Toronto Streets), at all the town's

banks and several other locations.

The fund-raising run, back in Uxbridge after a year's absence, begins in Elgin Park at 9 a.m. Registration is at 8:30 a.m.

In 1985, 300,000 Canadians helped raise a record \$3.6 million to aid cancer research in the memory of the late Terry Fox, a

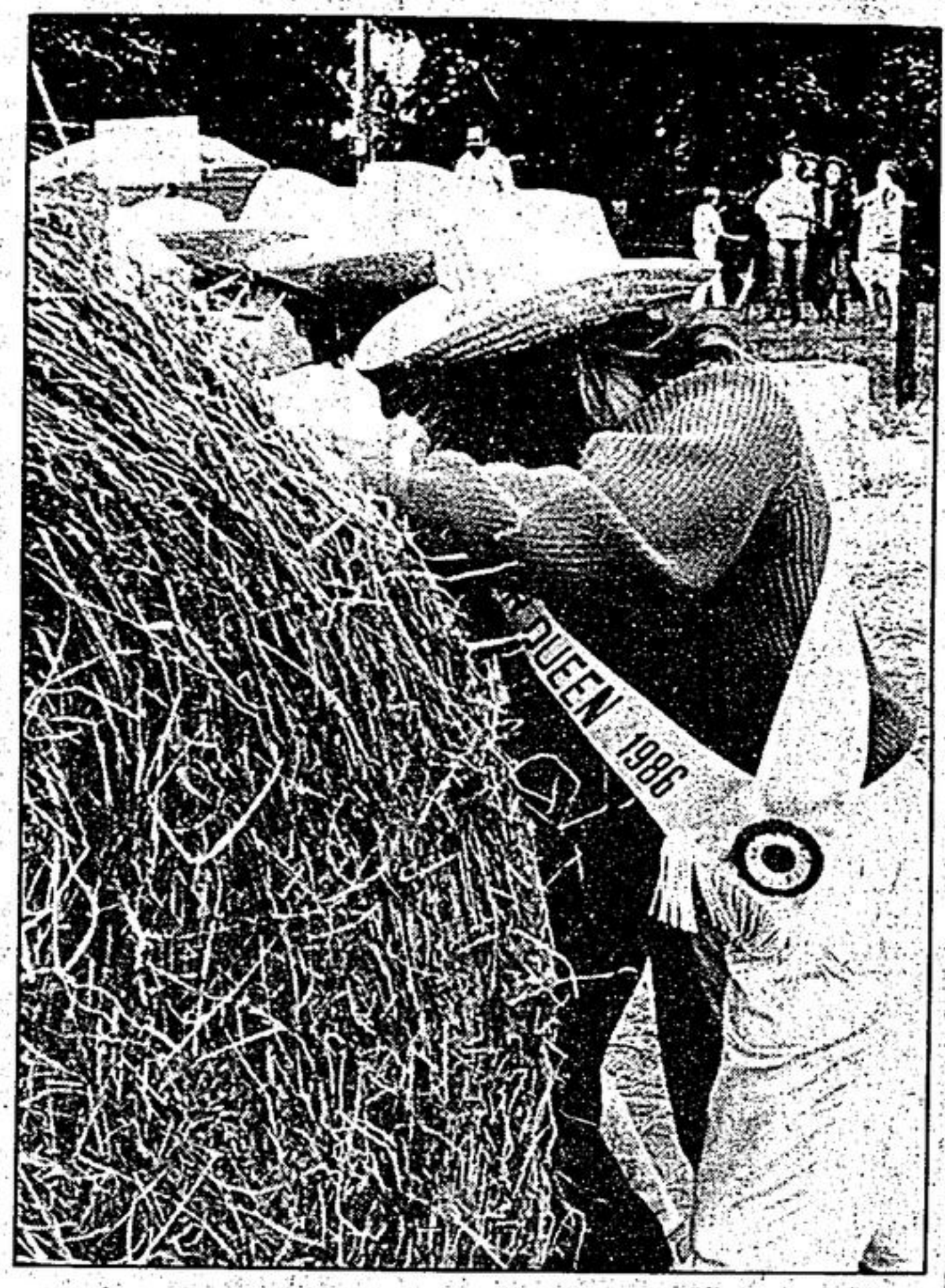
one-legged runner who attempted to cross the country in support of the cause. He died of the disease before he could complete his courageous trek.

Though the fund-raising event is called a run, most any form of transportation is acceptable including walking, jogging, biking, wheelchairs and rollerskating.
