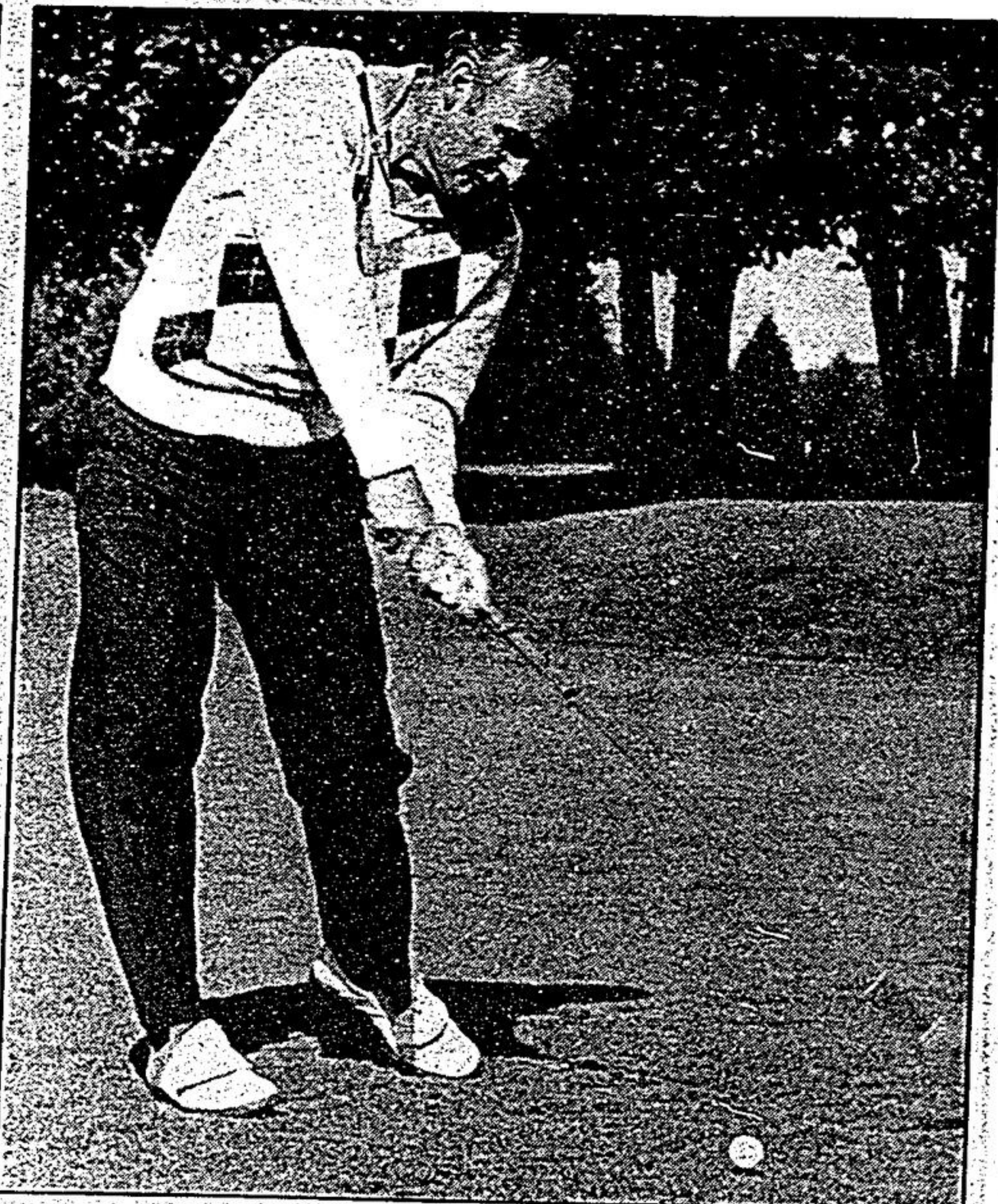

Hope-ing for a good shot

Fred Cox's annual Unionville Classic golf tournament just wouldn't be complete without Jack Hope (teeing off, above) and Glenn Crosby, who award their version of a most honest golfer award. The "receptient" at this year's edition, held last weekend at Thunderbird Golf Course, was Dennis Hastings. Threats to give it to Weekender Sports Editor Francis-King for a second straight year didn't come off. Unionville's George Shepherd won the tournament for the fourth time, shooting a 3-over 75.

Raiders defeated

Burlington proved far too tough for the three Markham Football Association teams to knock off, but Doug McKenzie's Bantams came fairly close.

After falling behind 22-7 at the half, the Raiders made the final count a respectable 35-24.

Besides Kurt Ianuzzo's one-yard plunge for a touchdown in the first quarter, all the scoring came in the final frame.

Quarterback John Walton ran in for six points, J.J. Heron gained 39 of his 80 yards rushing on two plays for a major, then Jeff Johnson grabbed a two-point conversion. The final points were on a two-point safety touch.

Coach McKenzie was happy with the point production, but worried about the defence.

"Offensively we were probably the better team," he claimed. "We had the ball about 60 percent of the game. But we don't have much team speed; our offence depends on grinding, and that takes time."

McKenzie was impressed with his offensive line (it "did a hell of a job"), and singled out the strong work of tackle Tom Walton.

As for the defence — "Burlington scored on a few big plays. (Still), we thought we had our kids prepared defensively, but they just didn't do it."

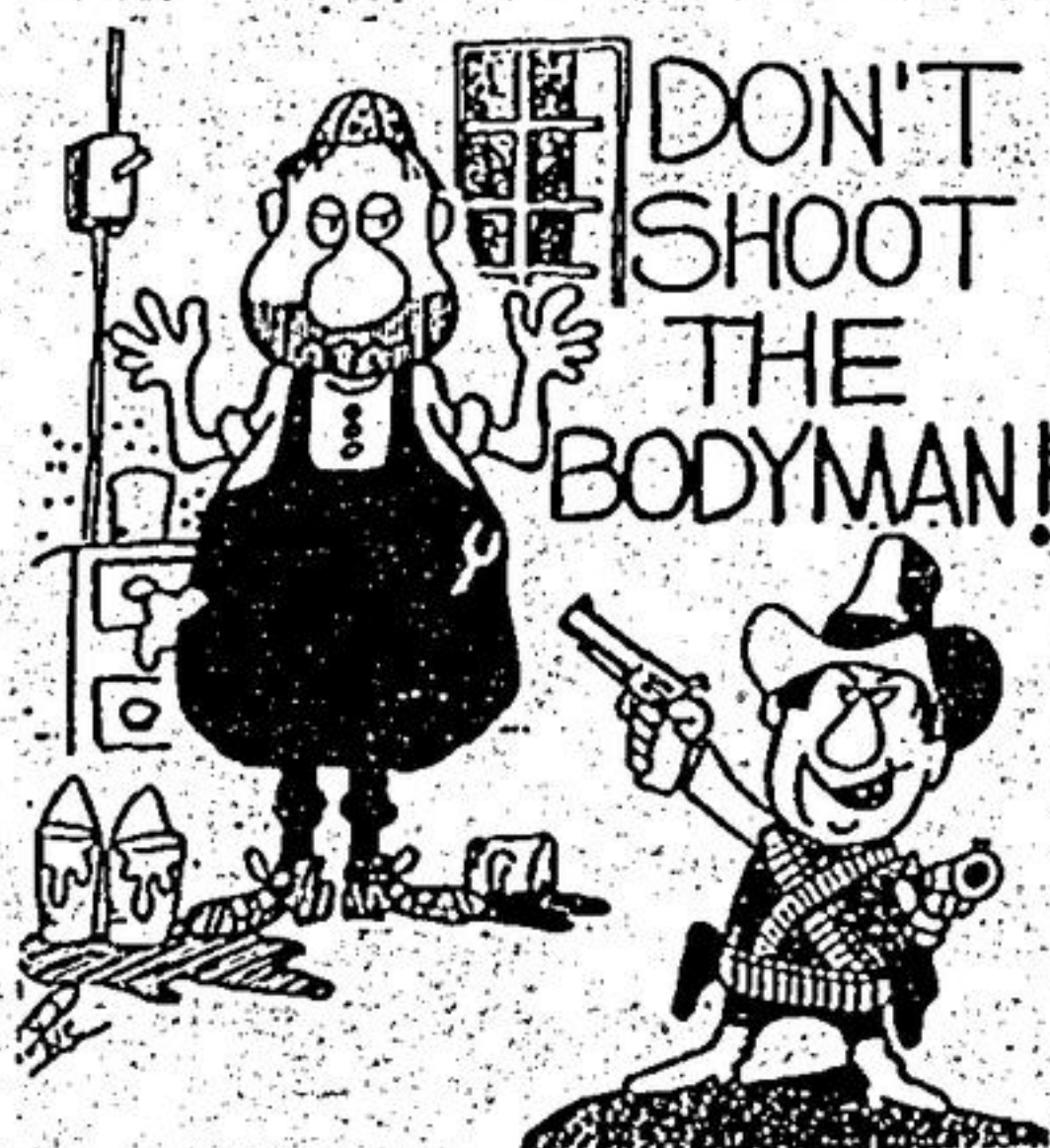
Meanwhile, John Beatty's Pee-wees were thoroughly trashed by a 58-0 margin.

"It was sort of a walkover," was his understated way of putting it. "Burlington has just an incredible organization. They had five coaches and their own doctor."

But for a struggling club, making their first first-down was reason for optimism. Coach Beatty was also pleased with the pass protection his second-quarter pivot Joel Rehill received.

"It was just incredible, but Joel took too long to pass," he recalled. "Both (Rehill and Derek Candolini) did a good job, but they were up against a machine."

Both Beatty and McKenzie are figuring on better fortunes against Brampton this weekend. Results for Bob Prefontaine's Atoms weren't available at press time.
