

# Athlete is multi-faceted

Claremont's Chris Doyle brings new meaning to the term all-around athlete.

The 19-year-old is a member of Canada's national team for tetrathlon — a demanding four-event discipline that combines horsemanship with cross-country running, swimming and air pistol shooting.

Doyle was part of a five-member contingent that competed in Pony Club-sponsored tetrathlons at Scotland and England this August. Canada placed fifth and third respectively against the front-running English plus teams from the United States, Ireland, Wales and Scotland.

Doyle now plans to begin training for the modern pentathlon, an Olympic sport that adds fencing to the tetrathlon events.

His athletic prowess also extends to everything from football to badminton, a sport he expects to play while attending the University of Western Ontario in a general arts program.

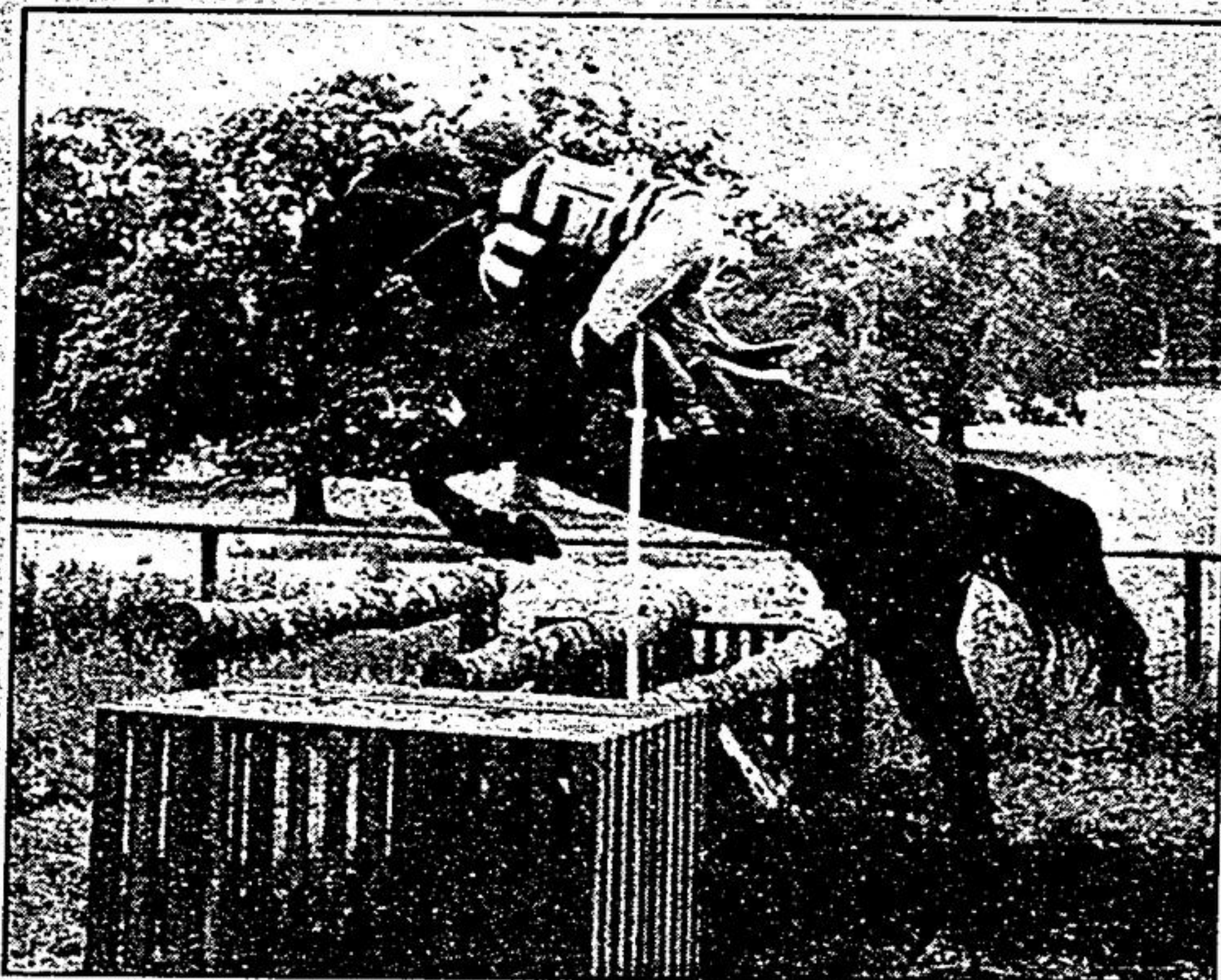
The Trinity College graduate and former Pickering High School student is also a star member of the Claremont Pony Club.

The 36-member club has found a new home this year at Brock Hill Equestrian Centre, on Brock Rd. north of Claremont. A registration night will be held there Friday, Oct. 3 from 7 to 9 p.m.

Pony Club riders gather at Brock Hill the first and third Friday of the month, with a mounted meeting planned one Sunday a month. Parent volunteers are required to assist with this multi-faceted, international training group for riders up to age 21.
