It's a golf game called 'Off Course'.

Anyone can play it, even a duffer, say inventors, Larry Peacock, Peter Street and Dave Forfar, Timbermill Crescent, Markham.

Now being marketed under the name of SLADE, (Suzanne and Larry, Ann and Dave Enterprises), this husband and wife foursome feel they've come up with a real winner—a hole-in-one so to speak.

It sells for \$19.95 and is presently available at two locations: The 19th Hole Golf Shoppe, McCowan Road and Hwy. 7, Markham, and the Dynamic Golf Centre, Thornhill. Larry and Dave hope to expand its availability throughout Ontario and even into the United States.

The two men, both Town of Markham firefighters, have long been avid game-players. One day, 3 1/2 years ago, they put their heads together and decided to come up with something of their own.

"How about golf?" Larry asked.

"Off course," replied Dave. That's how the game and the name of the game all got started. They've sold more than 100 sets in less than two weeks.

It's colorful, both the board and the box. The graphics were completed by David Scurr of Kitchener. "He brought it to life," says Larry.

Two, four or six people can play. The speed of the game is fast, taking less than two hours.

"Certainly, it appeals to golfers," says Dave, "but you don't have to be a golfer to play."

Like golf itself, it's a combination of luck and skill," explains Larry.

Production of 1,000 sets represents an investment of about \$16,000.

Both men admit to an interest in golf. Larry worked at a Markham area club several years.

"Did that help?" they were asked.

"Off Course," they replied in unison.

Sexual assault still unsolved

Toronto and Regional Crime Stoppers and York Regional Police are seeking the assistance of the public in an effort to solve a sexual assault in Newmarket.

During the early morning hour of Aug. 11, 1986 (3 am) a young female employee of the Mr. Donut Store, 391 Yonge Street South, Newmarket was working alone inside the store.

The victim happened to be in the rear of the store when she heard the front door open. Seconds later, she was confronted by a male suspect who was brandishing a knife.

He grabbed the victim and pushed her out the rear door, dragged her to a dark area at the rear of the complex, where he sexually assaulted her and threatened her with the knife.

He covered her face and fled into the darkness. The victim made her way back to the Donut Shop where she called the Police. The suspect made good his escape.

From investigations, it appears this assault is very similar to a previous sexual assault at the Aurora Donut Shop, this summer.

The wanted man is described as: male/white, 20's, rough voice, dressed completely in black and wore a balaclava covering his face.


