

York Region

Architect hired to design new administrative centre

 The architect of the National Museum of Man in Ottawa has been hired to design York Region's new administrative centre.

Douglas J. Cardinal, an Edmonton-based architect, was chosen from among 70 competitors to design the \$20 million structure to be built on Yonge St. in Newmarket. Included in this cost are architect's fees which could amount to as much as \$1.4 million.

The new 153,000 square foot building is expected to be six times the size of the current facilities. Due to be completed in the Fall of 1988, it will also be used as the new headquarters for the York Regional Police.

For the past six years, Mr. Cardinal's firm has been using what is known as CAD (Computer Assisted Design) to produce drawings faster and more accurately than was possible with traditional drafting techniques.

"Drawing that would take two to three weeks for a draftsman now take 10 to 15 minutes," he explained. "This enables us to spend more time...on creative efforts rather than on the drudgery of drawing with little graphite chips on paper," he added.

In the meantime, much of the \$400,000 in computer equipment residing in Ottawa will have to be moved to the Newmarket site.

Although the completed design of the building won't be known for at least another five months, its general appearance will reflect the rolling landscape and the history of the area of York Region.

"The landscape will be extremely important in the overall design," he stressed.

"Whereas the prairies are very subtle, the landscape here is very dramatic and powerful," he said. "It calls for a rather different expression."

The 11.3 acre site will be heavily landscaped to provide a "sculptural setting," he added.

He also noted that the new building should utilize building materials commonly found in the region.

For example, the \$93 million National Museum project relies upon the same materials as those used in the construction of the Parliament Buildings — namely, stone and copper. Consistent with this philosophy, he is considering building the administrative centre out of brick.

"Architecture should have a sense of drama," he said, "especially public facilities."

According to York Regional Chairman Eldred King, the project will be funded from reserves totalling more than \$16 million and from the issue of \$4 million in debentures. Upon completion of the new structure, the current 25,000 sq. ft. administrative building will be sold, he said.

Major project to be revealed

A major announcement is expected Tuesday on a massive commercial development near Hwy 7 and Woodbine Ave in the Town of Markham.

According to Brian O'Connor, public relations consultant with the town, Mayor Carole Bell and representatives of the U.S. firm

developing the project will make the announcement on Tuesday afternoon at the ChimoHotel.

At last month's board of trade luncheon Mayor Bell said that an announcement was imminent on a one-million-square-foot development in the town.
