SAFETY & HEALTH RULES

• GARBAGE COLLECTION

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Under the Local Bylaw the following should not be placed out for regular garbage or trash collection. — Paint, Motor Oil, Gasoline, Acid, Liquid or Dry Chlorine, Live Ammunition or any other Liquid, Combustible or Explosive Materials.

ANYONE doing so would be subject to prosecution.

DEFINITIONS

"Garbage" means all rejected, abandoned or discarded household waste, either animal or vegetable, wearing apparel, waste paper, broken crockery and glassware, bottles, cans, grass cutting, garden refuse and other refuse matter.

"Container" means a durable, rust-resistant, non-absorbent container larger at the top than at the bottom, having a close fitting cover and adequate handles to facilitate collections, with a diameter not greater than 0.5m and a height not greater than 0.9m.

A plastic bag designed and sold for the purpose of containing garbage and secured so as to prevent any spillage.

"Ashes" means the solid residue of any fuel used for heating or cooking purposes, cleaning from chimneys, and includes wood, coal or charcoal ashes. Ashes must be cold and placed in a metal container and not mixed with any garbage.

"Trash" means weighty or bulky articles such as stoves, fencing, furnaces, bed springs, furniture boxes and barrels or anything of a similar nature but does not include ashes or non-collectible waste.

NON-COLLECTIBLE WASTE

Means any waste or matter other than garbage or ashes and shall include the following:

- 1) manufacturers waste including wire
- b) celluloid cuttings, moving picture film, oil soaked or gasoline soaked absorbent material, and any explosive or highly combustible material of any nature whatsoever;
- c) broken plaster or other waste or residue resulting from the construction, alteration, repair, demolition or removal of any building or structure;
- d) sawdust and/or shavings;
- e) swill or other organic matter not properly drained or wrapped;
- f) liquid waste;
- g) bandages, poultices, dressings and other such waste;
- h) hay, straw and manure;
- i) animal waste and/or excrement
- j) carcass of any animal;
- k) live animals or birds;
- l) stock of any wholesaler which shall be regarded as manufacturers waste;
- m) any material which has become frozen to the receptacle and cannot be removed by shaking it;
- n) discarded truck and automobile tires;
- o) tree branches or roots exceeding 0.2m in diameter.

NOTE...

BROKEN GLASS AND TIN CAN LIDS CAN BE EXTREMELY DANGEROUS

Please Wrap your broken glass in newspaper or cardboard before putting in container and your can lids should remain inside the original can.
