

Conflicting evidence in death crash

STOUFFVILLE — Conflicting testimony has been given by a driver and his passenger, both witnesses to a car accident that took the life of a 17-year-old Stouffville girl.

William Hughes testified before a provincial court that the car ahead of him was trying to make a left turn at a speed of 70 km/hr. The driver of the car, Mr. Hughes was riding in told the court earlier the car was travelling about five to 10 km/hr.

Two men are standing trial on a charge of careless driving for their involvement in the accident that took place Sept. 29, 1985 at Ninth Line and 16th Avenue, Markham.

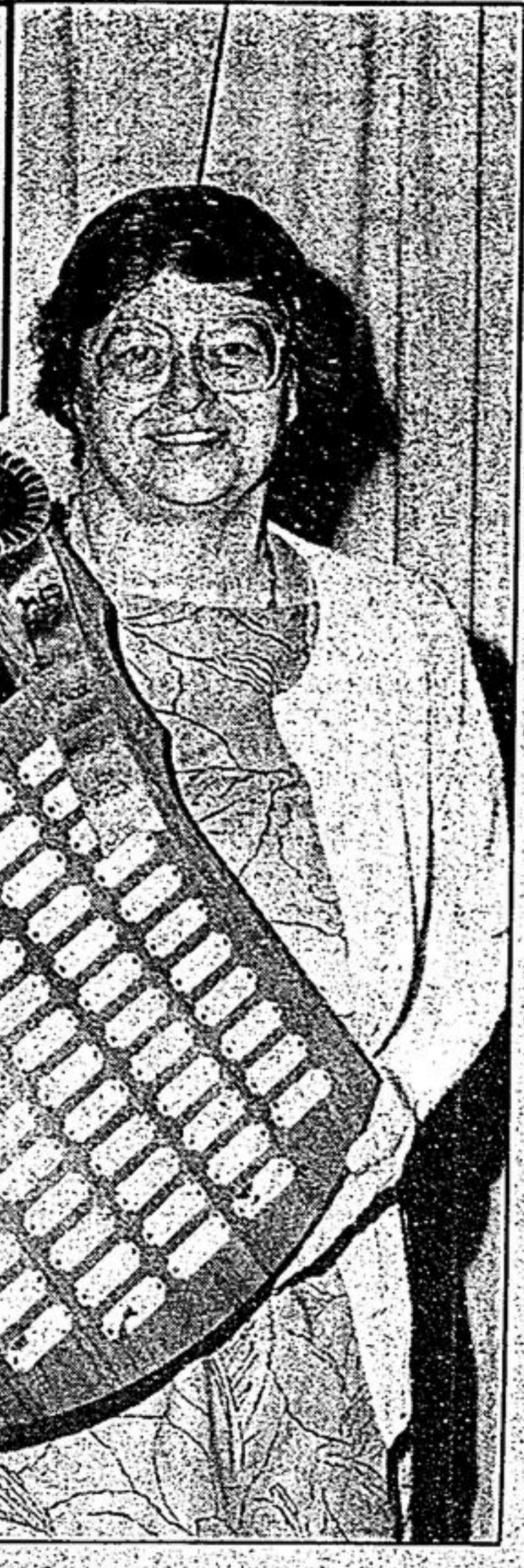
Mr. Hughes said he and Brian Langford stopped at David Spensley's home in Markham to invite Mr. Spensley and his house guests to a party in Stouffville.

Don't be caught empty handed

What could be more frustrating than to pull down a fire extinguisher and discover it empty? It's happened many times. But don't let it happen to you, warns Whitchurch-Stouffville Fire Chief Walter Smith. As with commercial, industrial and municipal buildings, home fire extinguishers should be updated every year, says Chief Smith. Houses, unlike public buildings, don't come under the Fire Code, he explained. In Stouffville, fire extinguishers can be taken to Card's Hardware, Main Street West. They are then picked up by Ron Cordingly of Uxbridge, examined and, if necessary, re-filled. The cost is about ten dollars. "By putting out one grease fire, an extinguisher will pay for itself ten times," Chief Smith stated.

Larry to unveil new cars Saturday

STOUFFVILLE — The 1987 Fords are here and Larry Cotter is celebrating. The local Ford-Mercury-Lincoln dealership on Hwy. 48 near Dickson's Hill is holding an 'open house' this Saturday, (Oct. 11), from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. There will be free hotdogs, soft drinks and balloons for the kids. Larry and staff will also be introducing their new '87 models—the Ford Crown Victoria, the Mercury Grand Marquis, the Tempo, the Topaz, the Tracer, the Taurus, the Sable, the Ranger and the Bronco II. Mr. Hughes replied that he wouldn't. When Mr. Hughes testified that he saw the Chevrolet turn on its

Mr. Hughes said he didn't see any difference between the two statements. In other testimony, David Spensley, a passenger in the fifth car on Ninth Line told the court he didn't believe Mr. Langford's Camaro and the Chevrolet were travelling at five to 10 km/hr at the time of the accident.

"I don't see how that's possible. Maybe Mr. Langford made a mistake. Maybe he was confused or nervous. There's no way he could have been going that slowly or I would have noticed," he said. The trial continues Oct. 20.
