# Stouffville Royals win again

It's anyone's guess where the Stouffville Royals will be next season.

After defeating Bradford 3-2 last Saturday in Newmarket to clinch its second straight York Region Soccer Cup, skipper Martin Johannessen outlined the options for his Royal crew.

The team can always stay put in the York Region League or it can make good on a ticket to the National Soccer League (NSL) or maybe join an inter-district league if one is formed. Mr. J. figures his bantam squad will know which way it's going by next month.

There was no question Saturday's rainy match against Bradford belonged to Stouffville. "We should have been up 3-0 at halftime," said Johannessen. Instead, Stouffville was up 1-0 after a 25-yard blast from Colin Hales.

Greg Cook made it 2-0 in the second half with an indirect free kick from 20 yards out. Bradford

managed to even the spread on a free kick and penalty shot, but it wasn't enough to monopolize the momentum.

After attacking from the left side most of the opening half, the Royals switched to the right side to shake Bradford's defence. Stouffville scored the winning goal with about 10 minutes remaining in the game.

A beautiful give-and-go set up at midfield saw Greg Cook feed rushing defender Jeff Carney. Carney passed to Jimmy Murby who was near the 18-yard box. Murby knocked the ball down with his chest and kicked it past the Bradford net-minder.

Carney's rush up field was "just one of those quirks we were trying to put into our game all season," said Johannessen.

It finally paid off.

This year's winning Royal squad included: goalie, Lindley Mussell, Colin Hales, Greg Cook, Jimmy Murby, Jay Edwards, Kyle Findlay, Craig Johannessen, Davide Petramali, Joey Waldherr, Jeff Carney, Tab Lamoureux, Jim Shadforth, Derrick Shellenberg, Guy Murfitt, Tony Trentadue and Wally Barbour.

The Stouffville Panthers, who finished the season in second place, were upset 2-1 by Markham in the York Region Cup last Sunday.

"I think Markham probably played its best game ever," said a dejected but still diplomatic Stouffville coach Alfons Rubbens. "I never saw Markham so high. We had seven or eight kids who were up for the game and that's it."

The loss snapped the Panthers' four-year unbeaten string in York Region playoffs. "When you win the Cup four years in a row, you become a real underdog. Everybody is against you," said Rubbens.

That two Panther goals were disallowed didn't help his team's cause. Trailing 2-0 at halftime, Travis White managed to score Stouffville's only goal.

The black cat's big captain, Charlie Melko, who was sidelined with an injury, was sorely missed when the contest degenerated into a push and shove match.

Rubbens, who called the refereeing "questionable", was surprised no cards were handed out for rough play.

"Overall I think it was Markham's gung-ho style of enthusiasm that won it for them," he summarized. "In a Cup final, you have to have that. We didn't."

NOTICE OF MEETING

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville will hold a public meeting on MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10TH, 1986 at 7:00 p.m. in the Whitchurch Centennial Community Centre, Ballantrae, Ontario (North side of Aurora Road east of Highway No. 48) to make available adequate information to the public regarding, and to consider, a proposed Official Plan Amendment to be passed pursuant to Section 17 of the Planning Act.

SUBJECT PROPERTY

The subject property comprises all lands in the Musselman's Lake area which are designated Lakeside Residential in the Official Plan.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The proposed Amendment would amend the Lakeside Residential policies for Musselman's Lake by exempting existing lots of record from the development restriction which limits the population to 1,000 persons. The purpose of the proposed Amendment is to permit the development of the few remaining vacant existing lots of record in the Musselman's Lake area, for residential purposes.

REPRESENTATION

ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and make written or oral representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed Official Plan Amendment. If you are unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the meeting. Written submissions should include a request for further notification, if so desired.

IN THE MATTER of an application by The Regional Municipality of York for approval to expropriate the land described in Schedule "A", hereto, in the Town of Markham in The Regional Municipality of York formerly in the Township of Markham in the County of York, for the purpose of:

- the widening and reconstruction of Warden Avenue (YR 65) in the Town of Markham, from a point approximately 400 metres south of The King's Highway No. 7 to a point approximately 650 metres north of 16th Avenue to a basic width of 36 metres with additional widenings at cuts, fills and intersections to provide a basic four lane roadway with turning lanes at the intersections of Warden Avenue (YR 65) and The King's Highway No. 7, Whitehall Drive/Glencove Drive, Baycliffe Road/Carlton Road, and 16th Avenue;
- the relocating, altering or diverting of 16th Avenue in the Town of Markham;

to provide a basic two lane roadway with two additional through lanes and left turn lanes at the intersection with Warden Avenue (YR 65); and

- the site preparation, fencing, grading, graveling and paving, together with the construction of concrete curbs and gutters, storm sewers, culverts and drainage works; the provision of illumination and relocation of traffic control signals at the intersection of Warden Avenue (YR 65) and The King's Highway No. 7; the provision of illumination, removal of existing traffic control signals and installation of permanent traffic control signals at the intersection of Warden Avenue (YR 65) and Whitehall Drive/Glencove Drive; the provision of illumination and traffic control signals at the intersections of Warden Avenue (YR 65) and Baycliffe Road/Carlton Road and 16th Avenue; and the construction of all other related works and undertakings.

NOTES:

- The Expropriations Act provides that:
  - Where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Attorney General;
  - The inquiry officer,
    - shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and
    - may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such cost forthwith.
- "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the act as follows:

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested.

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper land registry or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.
- The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
