

# Betz hockey oldtimers not too old

Stouffville's premier oldtimers hockey team — Betz Pools Clippers — reached the C division finals at the Crown Life Tournament in Thornhill two weekends ago. win proved that Stouffville's strength, besides young scorers, is a strong defence. Corner, Lionel Villeneuve, Steve Ellis, Al Hachey and Davis were superb all weekend and particularly in this tough semifinal. Youngsters Cain, Blair and Weatherall scored the goals. Blair was awarded the game stick. Stouffville's opponent in the Sunday final was Burlington Old Boys. This team had scored 26 goals in four games, including 8-2 and 9-1 wins against Bistro 422 and Pine Point. Blair opened the scoring for Stouffville, but Burlington replied with three quick goals. Blair set up old 'Round' McKinnon to narrow the spread 3-2. However, Burlington scored again and the game ended 4-2. Blair received the game stick. This was Betz Pools second tournament of the season and the team has reached the finals both times.

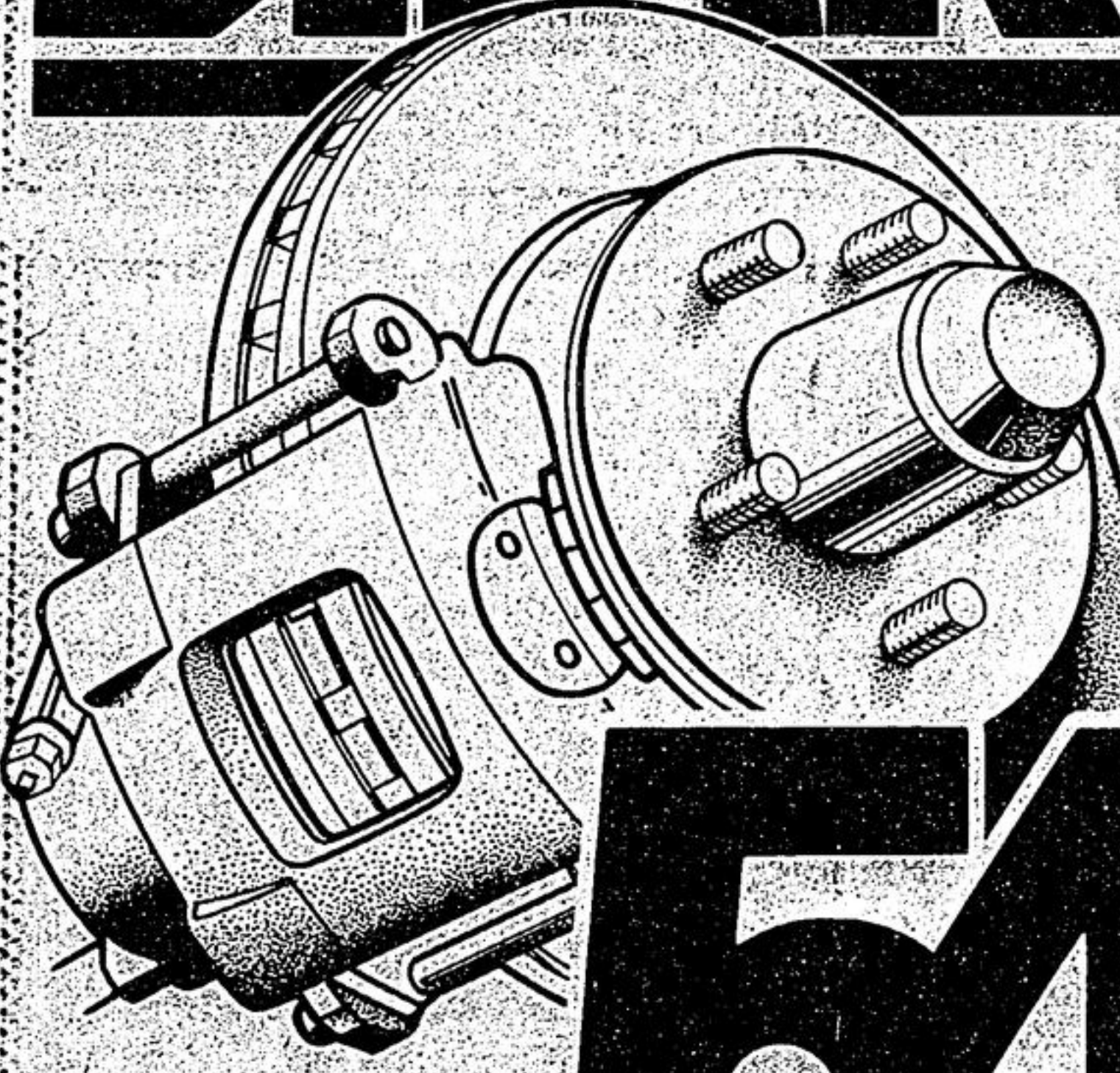
Only six teams had qualified for the round-robin finals two weekends ago. Stouffville defeated Ajax and Unionville earlier in the week to gain a berth in the last round.
