

Markham wins Stouffville tourney

After a slow start, Markham's Millionaire Oldtimers rallied to successfully defend their Opening Faceoff Betz Pools tournament championship last weekend.

The over-35 tourney team, coached by Ken Tucker, didn't look like the team that went all the way last year, dropping a 5-3 decision to '85 finalist Coxwell Olde Sports.

Gord Lefevre, Bert Dercola and Tucker supplied the offence.

Markham rebounded well in game two, using Bert Wood's strong netminding to shut out Pickering Pro Sports 5-0. Tucker, Dercola, Ken Kelly, Bruce Houghton and Ken Chupa did the damage.

Two-goal efforts from Chupa and Dercola were enough to pow-

er the squad past the Ajax Antiques 4-2 in the third outing. The win earned Markham a spot in the A division final.

The championship was a repeat of last year, with Tucker and company once again meeting Coxwell Olde Sports. This battle was a game of catch-up hockey for Markham.

Coxwell scored first, followed

by a goal from Kelly. Coxwell tallied again to carry a 2-1 edge into the second period, but the Millionaires then took over.

Tucker and Chupa put Markham ahead, with John Blogg netting the insurance tally late in the frame to complete the game's offence and give the locals a 4-2 win.

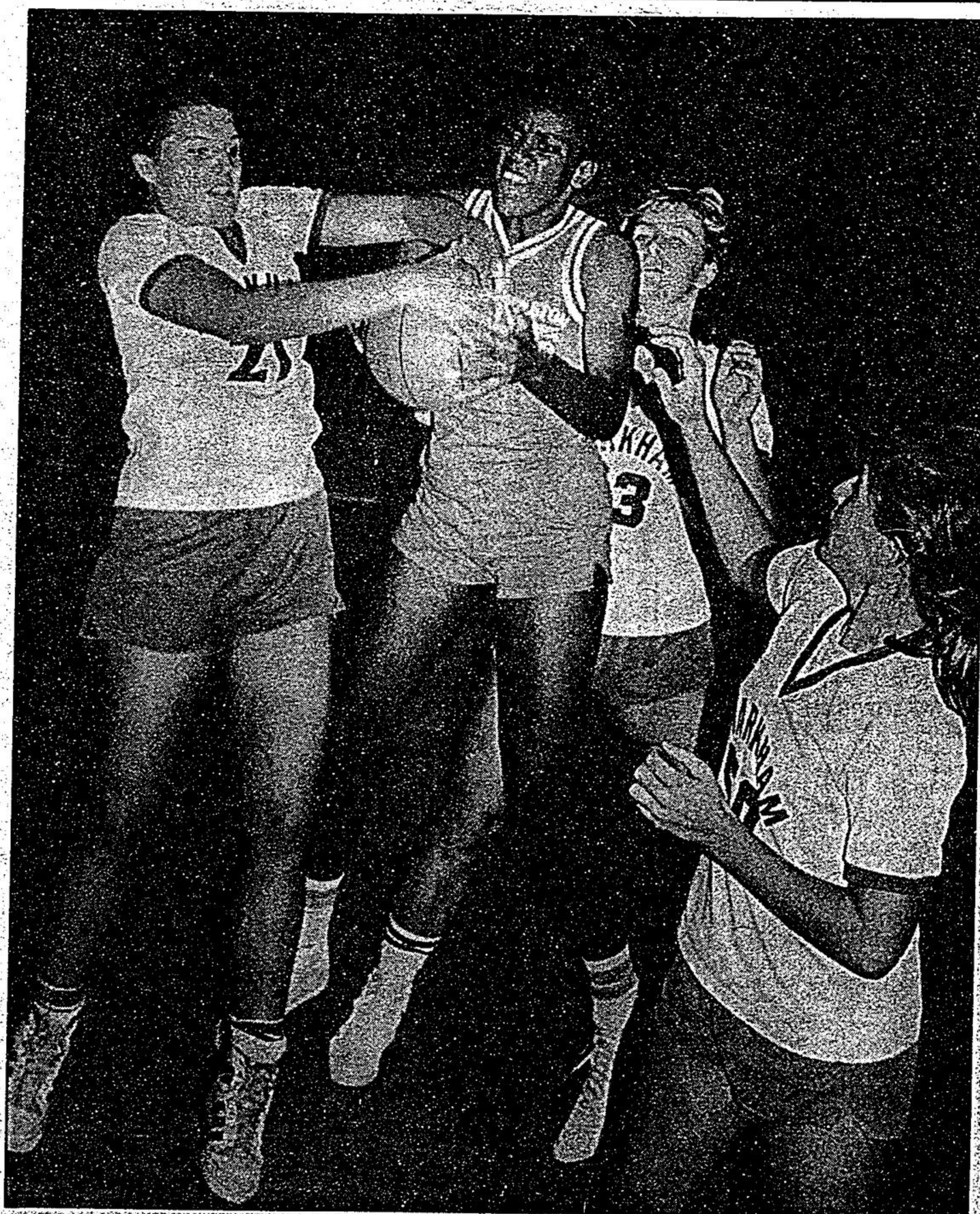
Coach Tucker, named Markham's MVP in game three, said his troops would be back to defend

But they finally had their chance to meet Thornhill, and took a 3-2 victory for their fifth straight York title.

Trevor Sloan opened the scoring by heading in Adam Laramore's corner kick at the 20-minute mark. Thornhill replied just before halftime.

Sloan (on a Lee Wilson pass) and Stuart Currie connected in the second frame to complete the Markham's offence. Thornhill drew within one goal, but could come no closer.

Over five years of league play, the squad has assembled 57 wins, just two losses, and four draws.
